Mandate

CMA 7¹ agreed on a list of mandated activities to be implemented on an annual basis from 2026 to 2028 with an aim to identify and respond to challenges in reporting by developing country Parties, including challenges in developing and maintaining their national systems; identify possible solutions to those challenges, including consideration of challenges in and possible ways of implementing those solutions; and reflect on how the implementation of those solutions addresses the challenges identified by Parties.

Pertaining to SBI 64, the secretariat is requested to develop and implement, in collaboration with the Consultative Group of Experts and other constituted bodies and relevant partners, as appropriate, the following activities:²

- Conducting a survey to gather information from Parties about the benefits and outcomes of and lessons learned from the implementation of activities mandated in decisions 18/CMA.5 and 21/CMA.6; and preparing a report on the survey for consideration by SBI 64;
- Preparing a synthesis report to be made available three weeks prior to SBI 64, on views from Parties submitted via the submission portal on experience and challenges related to implementing Article 13 of the Paris Agreement, including on preparation of biennial transparency reports, establishment of institutional arrangements, projections of greenhouse gases, data management tools, project management tools for the preparation of biennial transparency reports, stakeholder engagement, tracking support needed and received, navigating the modalities, procedures and guidelines for the transparency framework for action and support referred to in Article 13 of the Paris Agreement, including the flexibility provisions therein, and managing human resources, as well as on information reported in developing country Parties' biennial transparency reports;
- Organizing a workshop in world café format, to be held at SBI 64 for Parties to reflect on the survey report, the submissions from Parties and the synthesis report, as well as for Parties to engage in a structured dialogue with the Global Environment Facility and its implementing agencies, as appropriate, with a view to exploring opportunities for further simplifying and streamlining the process that enables Parties to access resources for preparing their biennial transparency reports, including by enabling them to access resources for two biennial transparency reports and/or a national communication as part of the same enabling activity and raising the threshold for expedited approvals.

Overall approach

The workshop will be convened in person and in a world café format, to enable interactive exchange of views and discussion among Parties, as well as with the GEF and its implementing agencies. The event is open to all SB 64 participants. National transparency experts and national focal points involved in transparency-related activities are strongly encouraged to attend the workshop.
