





# How are LRs considering the issues





The LRs requested the secretariat to prepare the RPG for 2022 by incorporating the approaches discussed and agreed at the 9th meeting of LRs. These approaches include cross-cutting issues and progress towards the target, such as [(1) acknowledging continuous improvements and noting recurring reporting issues;] [(2) approaches to technical assessment of the achievement of the 2020 quantified economy-wide emission reduction targets;] (3) [Carry – over of recommendations and encouragements by ERTs of BR5s under the Convention to the TERs of the BTRs1 under the Paris Agreement] and [(4) updated scoreboard for assessment of completeness and transparency for NCs]. The LRs agreed that the review approaches presented in the RPG 2022 should be applied by the ERTs in reviews of BR5s and NC8s.

The LRs also requested the secretariat **to continue collecting information on and analysing** the review-related issues raised by the ERTs during future BR reviews, with a view to presenting them for discussion at future meeting of LRs, as needed.
