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
Lima work programme on gender

- Annual report on gender composition of delegations
 - [FCCC/CP/2017/6](#) and [FCCC/CP/2018/3](#) (forthcoming in 2019)
- Provide support to the organization of training and capacity building by relevant organizations
 - **Support provided to a variety of training and capacity building during 2017, 2018 and 2019**
- Maintain and regularly update the UNFCCC Gender and Climate Change web pages for sharing information on women's participation and on gender-responsive climate policy (**see next slide**)
- Annual in-session workshop in conjunction with the sessions of the subsidiary bodies in 2018 and 2019
- Technical paper identifying entry points for integrating gender considerations in workstreams under the UNFCCC process

Priority Area A – Capacity-building, knowledge sharing and communication

Activity A.2: Organize a dialogue under the Action for Climate Empowerment agenda on how Parties and observer organizations have promoted the systematic integration of gender considerations in the six elements of Article 6 of the Convention

- 6th Dialogue on Action for Climate Empowerment held during SBI 48 in 2018 incorporated request under GAP activity A.2

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Gender action plan

Priority Area B – Gender balance, participation and women’s leadership

Activity B.1: Promote travel funds as a means to support the participation of women in national delegations at UNFCCC sessions, including those from grass-roots, local and indigenous peoples communities from developing countries, the LDCs and SIDs

- Co-hosted networking events during COP 23 and SBI 48 with WEDO as administrator of the Women Delegates Fund (ongoing at SBI 49 and COP 25)
- Promoted the existence and importance of travel funds through an article in the UNFCCC Newsroom, shared widely via UNFCCC social media channels
- Included references to the importance of travel funds in presentations on the gender action plan



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Gender action plan

Priority Area B – Gender balance, participation and women’s leadership

Activity B.2: Include in regular notifications to Parties at the time of nominations to UNFCCC bodies the latest report on the gender composition of the relevant body

- Elections and membership webpage includes prominent reference to the goal of gender balance and link to latest gender composition report
- Data on the gender composition of each constituted body is included in the notification to Parties
- Gender team presented on the gender composition of constituted bodies at the contract group on elections during sessions



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Priority Area C – Coherence

Activity C.1: Hold a dialogue, open to observers, with the Chairs of UNFCCC constituted bodies to discuss the findings of document FCCC/TP/2018/1

- Dialogue held during SBI 48
- Broadcast, presentations and informal summary report of the Dialogue are available via the UNFCCC gender and climate change webpages



Priority Area C – Coherence

Activity C.2: Provide capacity-building to chairs and members of UNFCCC constituted bodies and technical teams of the secretariat on how to integrate gender considerations into their respective areas of work and on meeting the goal of gender balance

- Capacity-building sessions held with Adaptation Committee, Excom of Warsaw International Mechanism on Loss and Damage, Paris Committee on Capacity Building, Technology Executive Committee
- Presentations on mandates also made to CDM EB, CGE, LEG with future capacity-building sessions to be planned. New constituted bodies yet to be formally approached

Priority Area D – Gender-responsive implementation and means of implementation

Activity D.2: In cooperation with the UNEP DTU Partnership and the Climate Technology Centre and Network, invite interested stakeholders to share information on the incorporation of gender into technology needs assessments during Gender Day

- Event held on Gender Day at COP 24 in collaboration with Women and Gender Constituency



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Priority Area E – Monitoring and reporting

Activity E.2: Prepare a synthesis report on the submissions received under activity E.1

- [FCCC/SBI/2019/INF.8](#) Synthesis report on the differentiated impacts of climate change on women and men; the integration of gender considerations in climate policies, plans and actions; and progress in enhancing gender balance in national climate delegations

Activity E.4: Encourage knowledge exchange activities among secretariat staff across all thematic areas to update on work related to gender

- In progress, including in the context of capacity-building for constituted bodies, events, documents
