- Advancing indicators on gender and climate change linkages



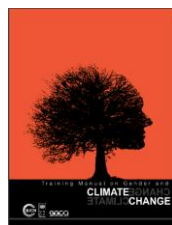

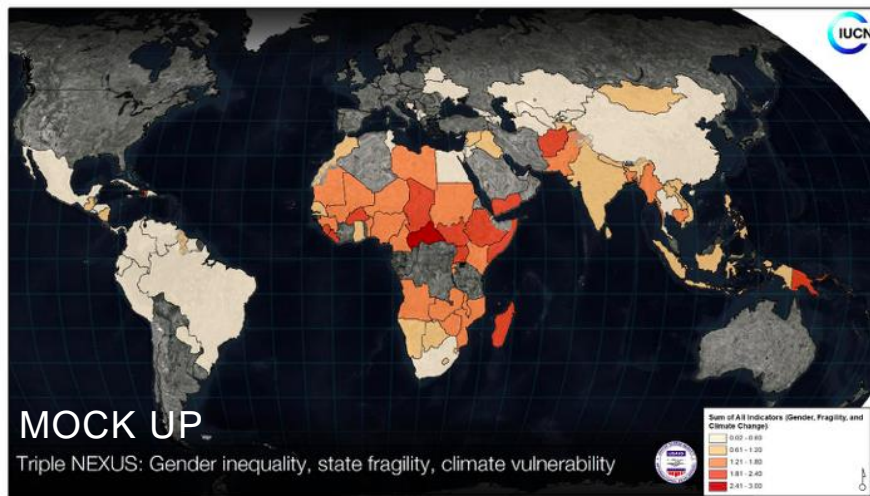


Few energy frameworks analyzed recognizing the need to increase women's participation in the energy sector, constituting a lost opportunity when experience and evidence shows the value of women's contributions.

FILLING IN KNOWLEDGE GAPS ON GENDER AND CLIMATE CHANGES LINKAGES

Studying the nexus of gender inequality, climate related vulnerability and state fragility to inform prioritised actions

A contented survey conducted in 2006 revealed that gender based violence is observed in at least 59% of climate related projects for over 2000 projects. Despite its prevalence, 46% of respondents prioritised actions based violence is not considered a priority in their office or programme.

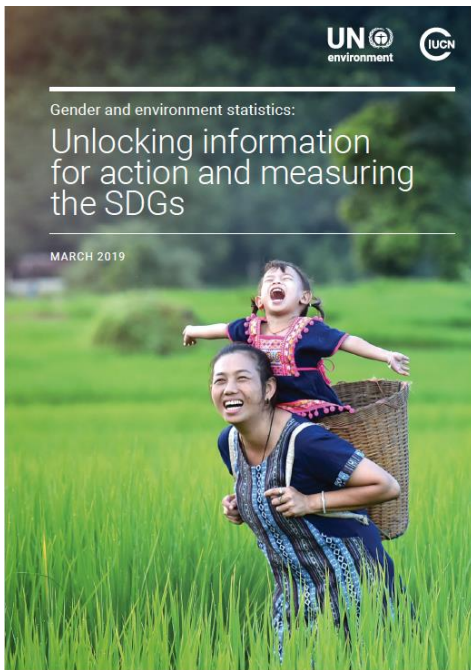


IMPLEMENTING TECHNICAL SUPPORT WITH PARTNERS
