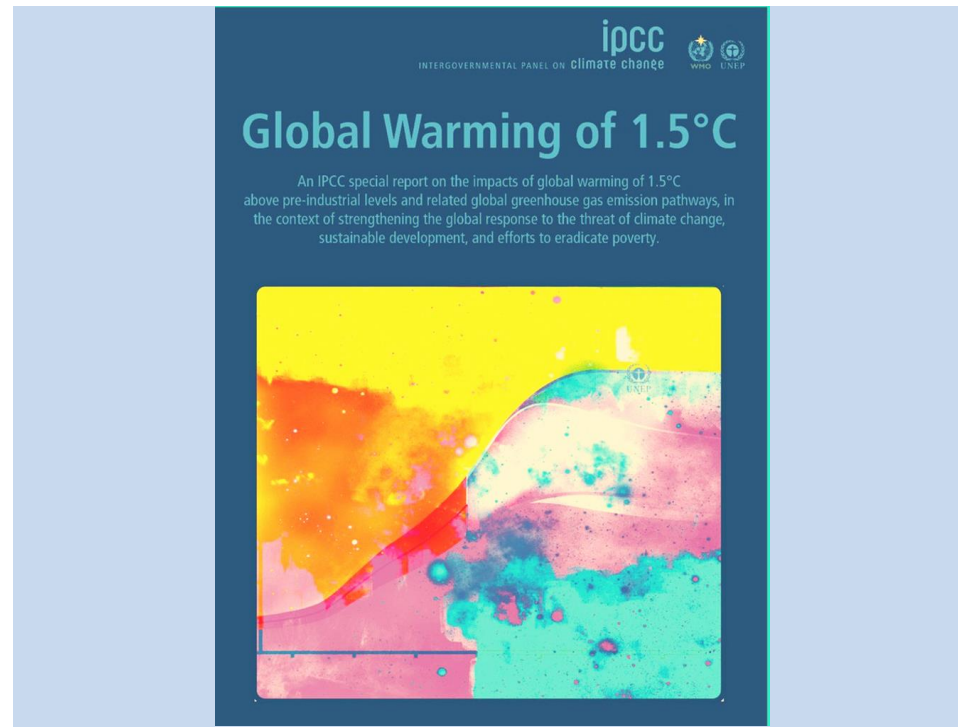

Key Mandates of the Doha work programme

Flexible framework for country-driven action (2012-2020)

Policy

- Integrate ACE into existing climate change programmes and strategies
- Prepare a national strategy on ACE
- Integrate climate change into the curricula

Focal Point

- Designate and provide support to an ACE national focal point

Implementation - six ACE elements

- According to the specific needs and circumstances

Non-Party stakeholders

- Foster the participation of all stakeholders in ACE implementation

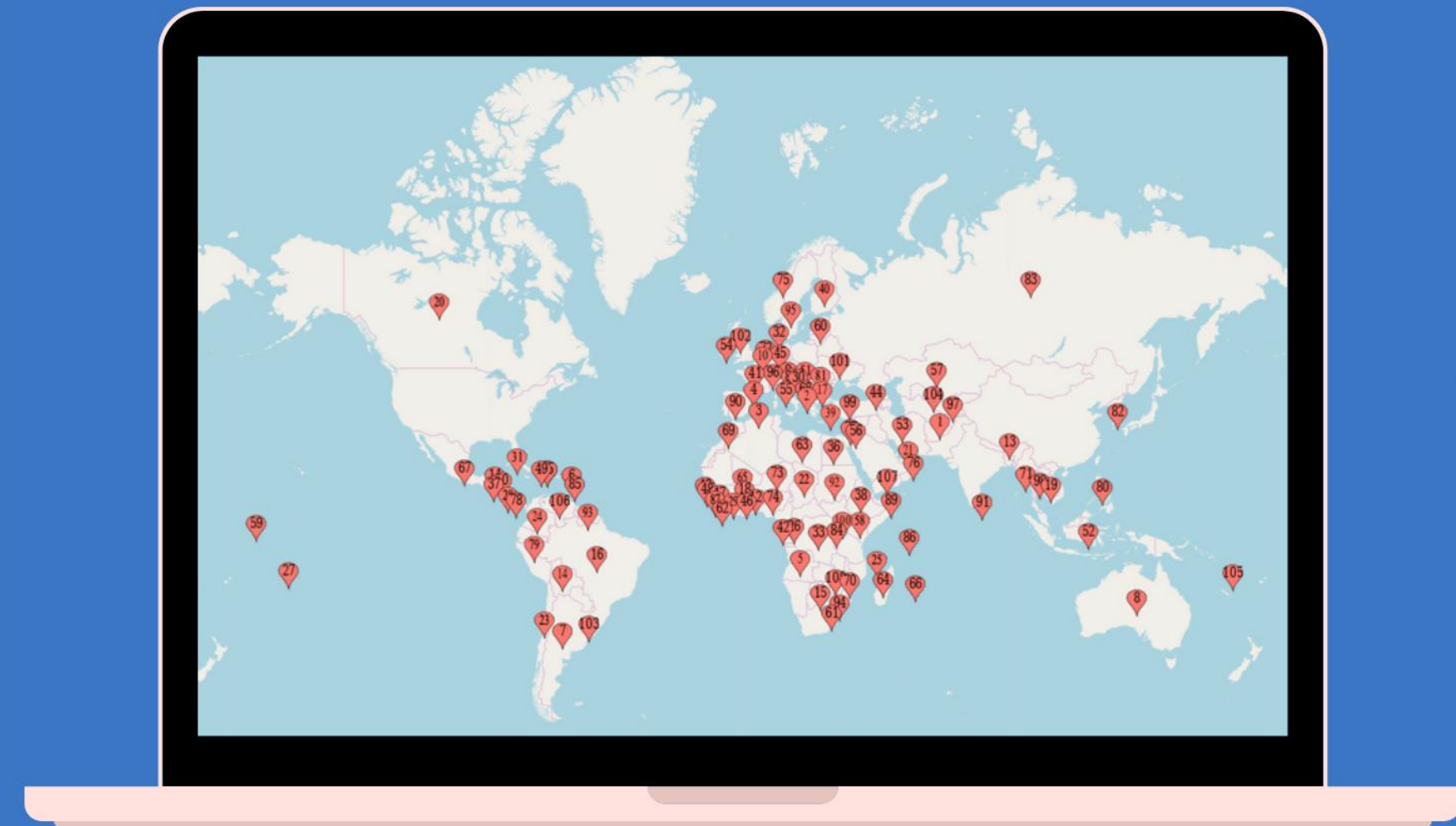
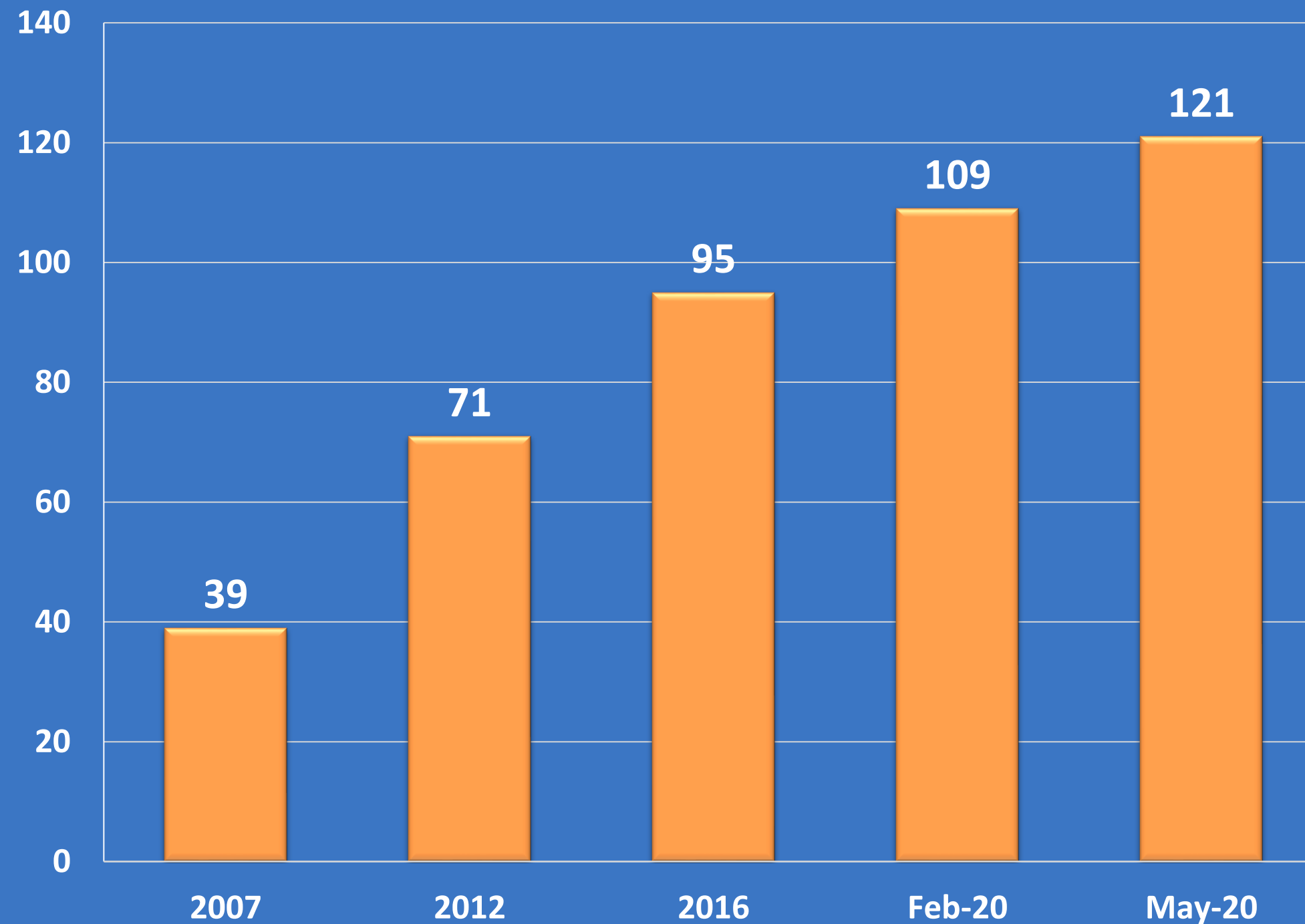

ACE Decision 17/CMA.1

Paris Agreement work programme

- **Alignment and avoid duplication:** In 2020, when reviewing the Doha work programme on Article 6 of the Convention, to also include efforts related to the implementation of Article 12 of the Paris Agreement
- **Integration of ACE** into nationally determined contributions, national adaptation plans, long-term low greenhouse gas emission development strategies and climate policies
- **Development and implementation** of ACE national strategies in relation to Article 12 of the Paris Agreement
- **Nomination of ACE focal points:** Parties that have not already designated one to do so and to provide the necessary institutional support
- **Foster participation** of non-Party stakeholders to scale up the implementation of Action for Climate Empowerment





Terms of reference for the review of the implementation of the Doha work programme on Action for Climate Empowerment

Objectives

With a view to encouraging improvement based on experience, the objectives of the review of the implementation of the Doha work programme are:

- To **take stock of the progress** made in the implementation of the Doha work programme and Action for Climate Empowerment to date, noting that this work is still ongoing;
- To **evaluate effectiveness, and identify essential needs, emerging gaps in and barriers** to the implementation of the Doha work programme;
- To **identify good practices and lessons learned** with a view to their dissemination, promotion and replication, as appropriate;
- To **identify recommendations and possible further actions** on enhancing the implementation of Article 6 of the Convention and Article 12 of the Paris Agreement, with regard to future work on Action for Climate Empowerment, following the review of the Doha work programme.

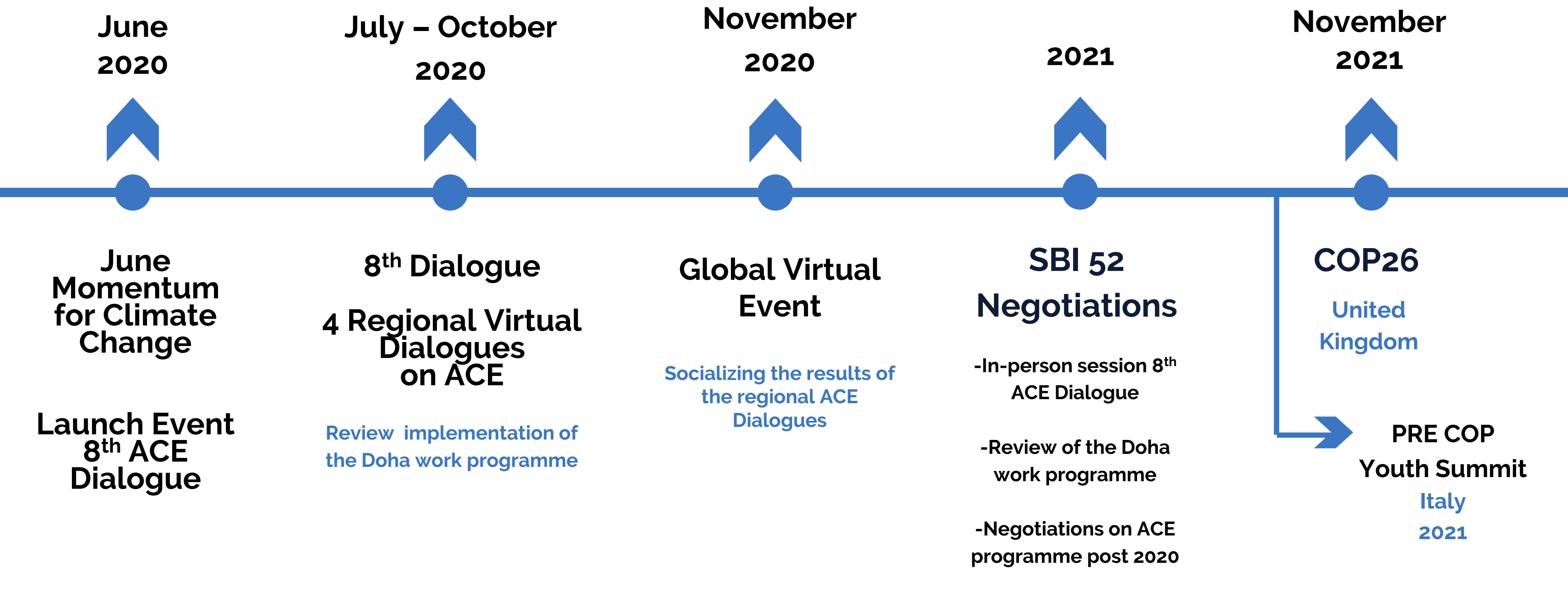
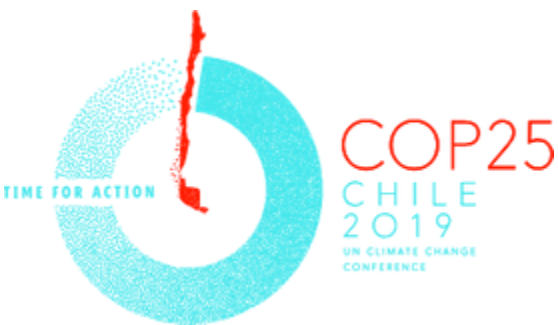
