



## Concept note for Technical event on information to be provided on impacts of response measures for technical assessment component of the second GST

Dates: Friday, 12 June 2026, 16:00–18:00 (CEST)

Venue: Addis Abeba, World Conference Centre Bonn (WCCB), Bonn, Germany

### Background and mandate

In decisions 6/CP.30, 2/CMP.20, and 14/CMA.7, the COP, CMP and CMA decided that the forum will conduct an activity to determine the information to be provided for the technical assessment component of the second global stocktake at SB 64 (June 2026) (activity 2<sup>1</sup> of the workplan of the forum and its KCI for 2026-2030).

Global stocktake (GST) is an assessment of collective progress towards achieving the purpose and long-term goals of the Paris Agreement on a five-year cycle. The modalities for the GST are set out in decision 19/CMA.1.

In accordance with the modalities of the global stocktake (decision 19/CMA.1), the second GST will comprise of three components:

1. **Information collection and preparation**, focusing on gathering, compiling, and synthesizing information and preparing for conducting the technical assessment. This component will commence at CMA 8 in November 2026.
2. **Technical assessment**, focusing on taking stock of the implementation of the Paris Agreement to assess the collective progress towards achieving the purpose and long-term goals of the Paris Agreement, as well as opportunities for enhanced action and support to achieve its purpose and goals. This component will commence at SB 66 in June 2027.
3. **Consideration of outputs**, focusing on discussing the implications of the findings of the technical assessment with a view to achieving the outcome of the GST.

The first GST was undertaken in 2023 and concluded at COP 28 in Dubai. The second GST will commence in November 2026 at CMA 8 and conclude in November 2028 at CMA 10. Covering the period 2024–2028, the outcome of the second GST will inform Parties, in updating and enhancing, in a nationally determined manner, their actions and support in accordance with relevant provisions of the Paris Agreement, as well as in enhancing international cooperation for climate action.

Through decisions 19/CMA.1 and 23/CMA.3, the CMA established the mandate for the Forum and the KCI to contribute to the technical assessment component of the global stocktake. Paragraph 24 of decision 19/CMA.1 invited relevant constituted bodies and forums, among which the Forum is explicitly listed, to prepare synthesis reports in their areas of expertise for the technical assessment, with the assistance of the secretariat, while paragraph 32 of the same decision placed a specific obligation on the Forum to summarize its outcome for the purposes of the global stocktake. Building on these provisions, decision 23/CMA.3, paragraph 13, directly requested the KCI to prepare a synthesis report reflecting the relevant work of the Forum and its KCI as an input to the technical

assessment, with paragraphs 11 and 12 of the same decision setting out the procedural outline for how that information is to be prepared and submitted.

While a growing body of analytical work has examined the impacts of response measures under the forum and its KCI, an important consideration for the second GST is what information would be most useful in supporting the technical assessment. In this context, the technical event will provide an opportunity for Parties to exchange views on the information they would find most useful in relation to impacts of response measures, including how it could be organized and presented, as appropriate.

## Objective

The objective of this technical event is to facilitate an exchange of views among Parties on the information on impacts of response measures that would be most useful for the technical assessment component of the second GST. It will also provide an opportunity to reflect on how such information could be reflected, as appropriate, in the synthesis report to be submitted by the KCI as an input to that component.

## Structure

This technical event will follow an open dialogue format to encourage the sharing of views by Parties and relevant stakeholders.
