- Travel funds
- Providing fora / platform to elevate women's voices; discuss gender issues in spaces beyond UNFCCC:
- UN General Assembly; Commission on the Status of Women, High-level Political Forum, UN Governing Bodies' secretariats; Workshops and training for the other Rio Conventions
- Providing technical / substantive support
- for women delegates







Impacts

- Strengthened reflection of gender perspectives in discussions and outcomes of processes
- Evidence-building (from women experts bringing their experiences and knowledge)
- Greater visibility/profiling of gender issues
- Broader support; more gender champions and advocates
- Greater interest in and appreciation of gender issues from a broad range of stakeholders



GAP 2.0: Some ideas

- Travel funds: how do we systematize to broaden beneficiaries and ensure equitable representation?
- Engagement of women's machineries related entities at the national level
- Implement modalities to achieve gender balance in co-leadership or rotating leadership positions
- Introducing of quotas for national delegations
- Addressing systemic inequalities to improve women's participation in scientific fields including climate change and negotiations
- Promote women's access to land, training and green technologies at the local level, to enable them to become leaders
- Engagement of men allies and the International Gender Champions
