THE OPPORTUNITY

International cooperation on climate requires young leaders; however, if they are not trained on how to make a difference, then having a seat at the table is tokenistic.

- Over 40% of people on the planet are considered young, yet the average age of world leaders is $62^{(1)}$.
- Nearly 70% of people agree that political systems would be better if young people had a say in policy.⁽²⁾
- Many young people lack access to climate policy knowledge and existing virtual trainings are English-only and time zone bound.⁽³⁾</sup>

THE SOLUTION

By youth, for youth COP Training that:

- Empowers young people with relationship building and advocacy skills to ensure everyone is confident in their ability to make a difference at COP.
- Is virtual and self-paced with an open discussion forum and optional discussion sessions covering all time zones
- Offers strategies for caring for mental health care at COP.
- Provides a guiding resource book to support young people in identifying their goals before COP.
