


CORSIA was adopted by the 39th ICAO Assembly (2016) as the **first global market-based measure** for any industry sector

CORSIA complements the other three elements in the ICAO basket of measures:

- technological innovations
- operational improvements
- sustainable aviation fuels

Objective: Achieve ICAO's global aspirational goal of carbon neutral growth from 2020 (CNG 2020)

CORSIA Eligible Emission Units



To fulfil its CORSIA offsetting requirements for a compliance period, an aeroplane operator must purchase and cancel CORSIA eligible emissions units (CEUs) equivalent to its total final CO₂ offsetting requirements:

- CEUs are generated by eligible CEU programmes that meet the CORSIA eligibility criteria (A)
- Operators purchase CEUs from the international carbon market (B)
- The cancellation of CEUs takes place within a registry designated by an eligible CEU programme (C)
- For transparency, cancellations are to be published on the registry's public website (D)





CORSIA Emissions Unit Eligibility Criteria (EUC)

The CORSIA EUC are approved by ICAO Council and used by ICAO Technical Advisory Body (TAB), which assesses the eligibility of emissions units and make recommendations to the ICAO Council decision, focusing on:

Are additional

Are based on a realistic and credible baseline

Are quantified, monitored, reported, and verified

Have a clear and transparent chain of custody

Represent permanent emissions reductions

Assess and mitigate against potential increase in emissions elsewhere

Are only counted once towards a mitigation obligation

Do no net harm
