The Draft WCRP Strategic Plan: 2019-2029

The WCRP Strategic Plan is based on the critical need for fundamental climate science, that will prepare society for challenges that we may not yet foresee. The plan is organized around:

Overarching objectives

The *Objectives* focus the climate research community on the far horizon and consider the scientific research that will be required to answer the substantial challenges with which society is presented. The objectives are:

- 1. Understanding the climate system
- 2. Advancing predictive skill on sub-decadal timescales
- 3. Constraining projections on decadal to centennial Capabilities timescales A vibrant worl

Research emphases

The *Emphases* highlight the bedrock science that must be supported and nurtured as new communities form and re-form around evolving scientific foci in support of the *Objectives*.
