Assessment of progress on NAPs in developing countries

Questionnaire to collect information in support of the assessment of progress in the process to formulate and implement National Adaptation Plans under the Subsidiary Body for Implementation

August 2016

The process to formulate and implement National Adaptation Plans (NAPs) was established in 2010 as part of the Cancun Adaptation Framework in 2010. Its objectives are:

- 1. To reduce vulnerability to the impacts of climate change, by building adaptive capacity and resilience:
- 2. To facilitate the integration of climate change adaptation, in a coherent manner, into relevant new and existing policies, programmes and activities, in particular development planning processes and strategies, within all relevant sectors and at different levels, as appropriate (decision 5/CP.17).

The process to formulate and implement NAPs is a series of linked and interdependent activities which, collectively and successively, lead to the formulation of NAPs and subsequent implementation of the policies, programmes and projects identified by them, to address adaptation covering all important sectors and issues in the country, on a continuing, iterative and coherent manner, with due consideration of broader development priorities and the long-term nature of climate change.

The process to formulate and implement NAPs is significant for enhancing adaptive capacity, strengthening resilience and reducing vulnerability to climate change with a view to contributing to sustainable development in the broader context of the global goal on adaptation referred to in Article 7 of the Paris Agreement. By decision 4/CP.21, paragraph 12(b), the Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI) is requested to assess progress made in the process to formulate and implement NAPs in May 2018, with a view to making recommendations thereon to the Conference of the Parties (COP), as appropriate. Relative to this, Parties are invited to provide information guided by this online questionnaire.

Information submitted before the **10**th of **September 2016** will be included in the annual report on progress on NAPs being prepared by the LEG for COP 22 as part of their 2016-2017 work programme. The information can be updated frequently to provide a time series.

The questionnaire is composed of four parts, as follows:

- **Part I:** Assessing progress based on the building blocks of the process to formulate and implement NAPs
- **Part II:** Support for the formulation and implementation of NAPs

The following activities have been proposed in the GCF Readiness Support Proposal to monitor NAP process in Bangladesh a) Set up NAP formulation team of multidisciplinary national/international experts to draft and finalize the National Adaptation Plan. This team will work in close coordination with the existing NAP Committee at NDA and climate change unit under the Ministry of Environment and Forests (MoEF). b) NAP first draft will be created by NAP formulation team. This draft will include identification of priority risks as well as activities to address those risks, with a focus on the priority sectors c) Develop a work-plan for NAP implementation for a duration of 3 -5 years, which also identifies activities for integration in national and sectoral development planning, programming and budgeting systems. As part of this effort develop a process and forum for reviewing NAP and updating priority actions beyond 3 year time horizon. d) Design M&E process and performance indicators for tracking CCA activities within priority vulnerable sectors, to be included in the NAP implementation plan. e) Coordinate review of the NAP draft f) Post draft National Adaptation Plan online for incorporating public comments/consultation g) Undertake a peer review of the National Adaptation Plan by national/internationals

- h) Develop a complementary communications and outreach strategy for the NAP. Link this to knowledge management activities, concomitantly developing information products for dissemination through digital, broadcasting, print and other communication channels that broadcast progress, results and lessons learned from NAPA and NAP Roadmap processes.
