UN Global Climate Action Awards Ceremony

Summary:

This marquee event is a moment of celebration at COP 25 to recognize the 15 winners of the 2019 UN Global Climate Action Awards. This event is expected to be one of the most dynamic and exciting events at COP 25, with inspiring speakers, videos, photography, and a musical performance.

Format of event:

The event will follow an award ceremony format. A reception with wine will follow.

Structure of event:

- The MC will open the event and invite the UN Climate Change Executive Secretary Patricia Espinosa up on stage to deliver opening remarks.
- The MC will thank the Executive Secretary and invite COP 25 President and Minister of Environment Carolina Schmidt to deliver a keynote speech (TBC).
- The Moderator will thank the COP 25 President, and then introduce a 5-minute video showcasing the 2019 winners of the Global Climate Action Awards from each of the four categories.
- After the video ends, the moderator will invite the winners from each of the categories up on stage to receive their award.
- To conclude the event, the MC introduces the music performer, and welcomes everyone to enjoy the upcoming reception.
