

- 1000 respondents, websurvey since 2015
- Nationally representative sample of respondents regarding geography, gender and age
- Subgroups: gender, age, residence, employment, education, car-driver



SWEDEN: Useful results for policy making


- I could take the following actions to reduce climate emissions...



Process and adjustments

- Swedish Environmental Protection Agency, performed by research company.
- Results are open and made publicly accessible.
- Data-sets shared with resarchers.
- Cost, approximate: 12 000 USD

"Imagine that in the future we changed to a completely *climate-adapted society with* greatly reduced emissions. How do you think that would affect your quality of life?"









SWEDEN: Methodology, strengths and weaknesses

- Long series of results, possibility to follow the same questions over time.
- Knowledge about attitudes both to state policy measures from the government and to measures that you take yourself to reduce climate change.
- Differences between agegoups, gender and can form a basis for outreach-activities
