
DELIVERING THE EU 2030 NDC AND 2050 NET-ZERO

The EU is taking strides forward under the **European Green Deal**, the blueprint for a green and inclusive transition.

The EU will reduce its net greenhouse gas emissions by **at least 55%** by 2030, compared to 1990 levels, and aims to be **climate-neutral by 2050. The European Climate Law,** in force since July 2021, writes these goals into law as the commitment the EU and its Member States have made under the Paris Agreement.

The vast majority of legislative proposals have now been adopted and will soon become EU law.


