

2030 climate solutions: Regional insights for global action

Subtitle: Engaging stakeholders across continents to strengthen NDCs and NAPs

Launched last year at COP28 by the Marrakech Partnership (MP) under the leadership of the High-Level Champions (HLCs), the [2030 Climate Solutions: an Implementation Roadmap](#) is a comprehensive and coherent climate action roadmap to accelerate climate action by 2030.

To ensure its implementation, the roadmap needs to:

- Reflects the context and needs of all regions,
- Be effective, inclusive, participatory and accountable,
- Contribute to providing solutions to the design of the next round of NDCs and NAPs.

To this end, the HLCs and the MP, in close collaboration with the UNFCCC secretariat and its Regional Collaboration Centres (RCCs), conducted a regional consultation survey to identify relevant dimensions for the 2030 Climate Solutions. They also held regional validation workshops for [Latin America and the Caribbean](#) (28 August - virtual), [Asia-Pacific](#) (29 August - virtual), and [Africa](#) (31 August - hybrid), bringing together over 250 stakeholders across the regions.

The workshops highlighted that although progress has been made, the first global stocktake revealed significant gaps in both ambition and implementation. They also emphasized that the next rounds of nationally determined contributions (NDCs) and national adaptation plans (NAPs) are crucial, requiring the involvement of and collaboration with non-Party stakeholders (NPS) in support of national governments.

The workshops presented regional priorities and barriers/enablers identified by stakeholders through the survey alongside the top 10 mentioned mitigation and adaptation action areas from NDCs/NAPs of countries in each region. This approach helped create a strong connection between NDCs/NAPs and perspectives of NPS on the ground, positioning the 2030 Climate Solutions as a roadmap to facilitate multistakeholder collaboration for the design and implementation of NDCs/NAPs.

Inputs from the workshops will be carefully considered and integrated in the upcoming Regional Outlooks for the 2030 Climate Solutions, to be published before COP29 in November.
