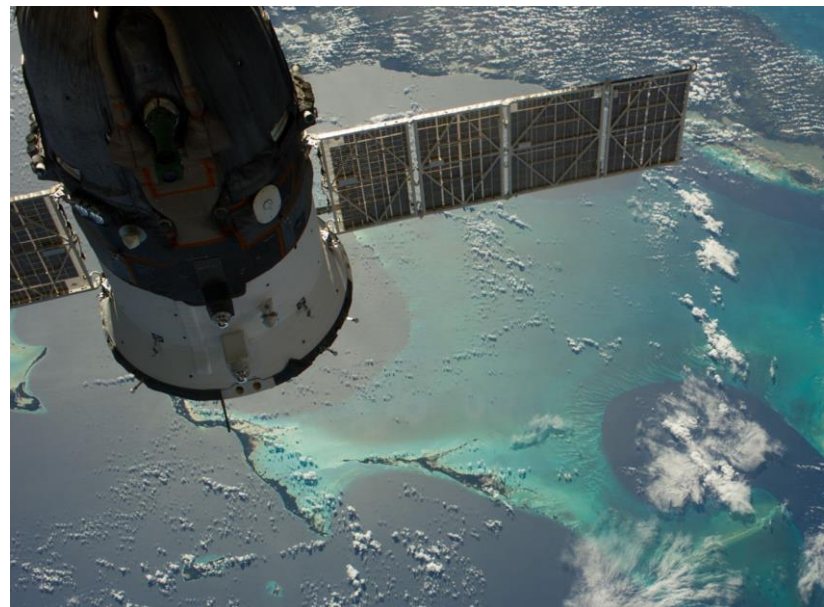


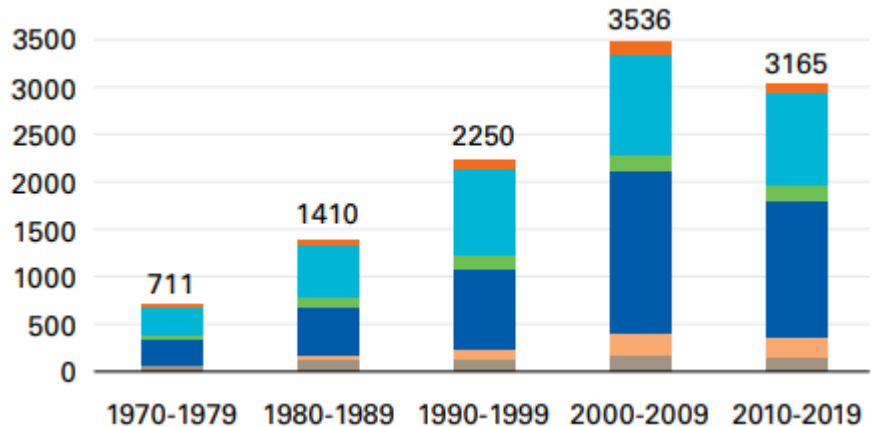

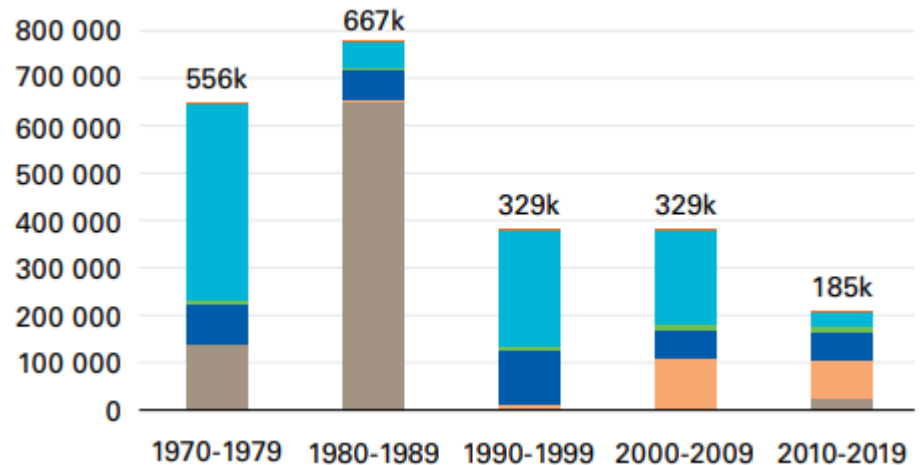


Risk information and EWS: Proven effectiveness

Total = 2 064 929 deaths

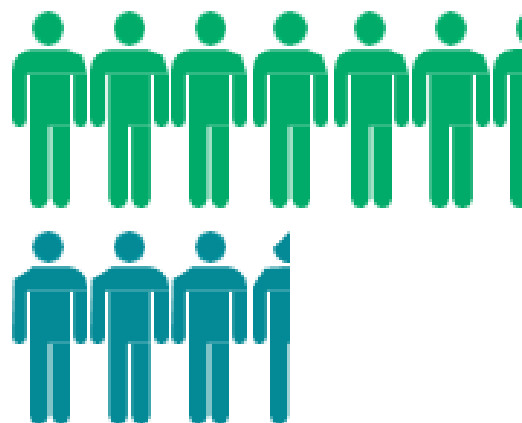
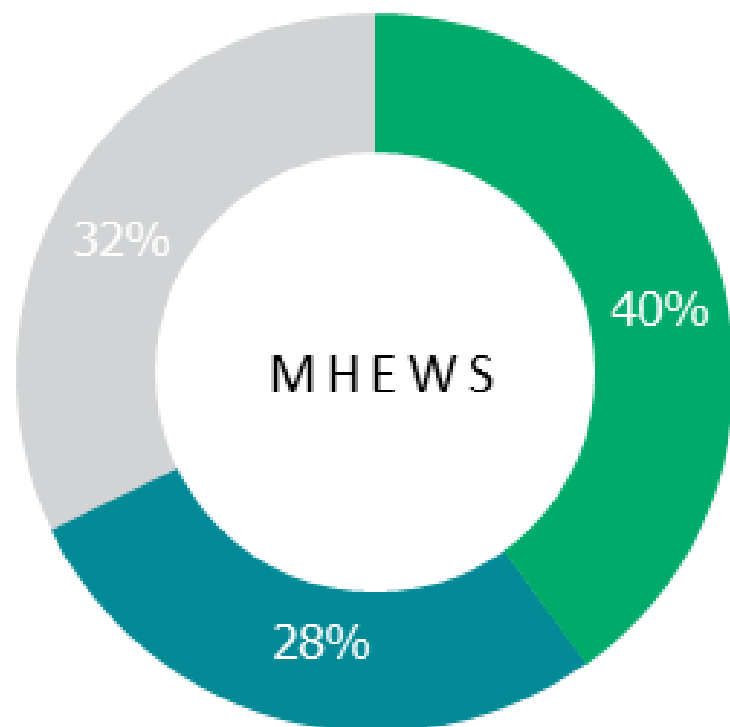


Drought

- ❑ 88% of LDCs and SIDS that submitted NDCs identified early warning systems as a priority
- ❑ Only 40% of WMO Member countries report having fully functional EWS in place addressing all relevant hazards
- ❑ One third of every 100,000 people is not covered by early warnings

Financial support for actions related to EWS

1. Climate Risk and Early Warning Systems

- ❑ Supports risk information and people-centered early warning system implementation in LDCs and SIDS
- ❑ Coordinated, pooled financing from eight donor countries
- ❑ Implementing partners: World Meteorological Organization, the World Bank and the United Nations Office for Disaster Risk Reduction

2. Climate Science Information for Climate Action

- ❑ Methods and tools for incorporating climate science information into climate action investments, plans and policies launched by WMO and the Green Climate Fund at COP 26
- ❑ Capacity development and hands-on support to Parties and Accredited Entities for adaptation action/EWS proposals by WMO, GCF and partners
- ❑ EWS financing and technical advisory services through projects
