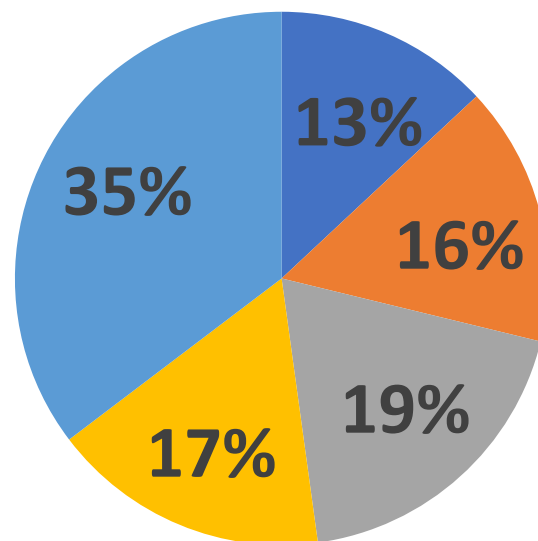

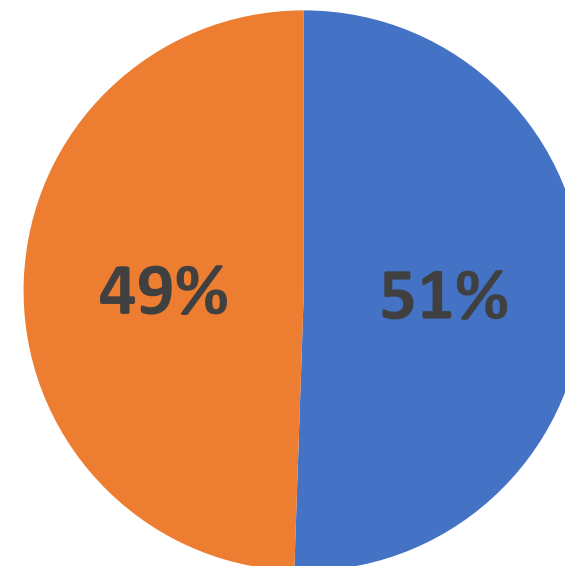
Regional distribution of BR3/NC7 experts

- NAI

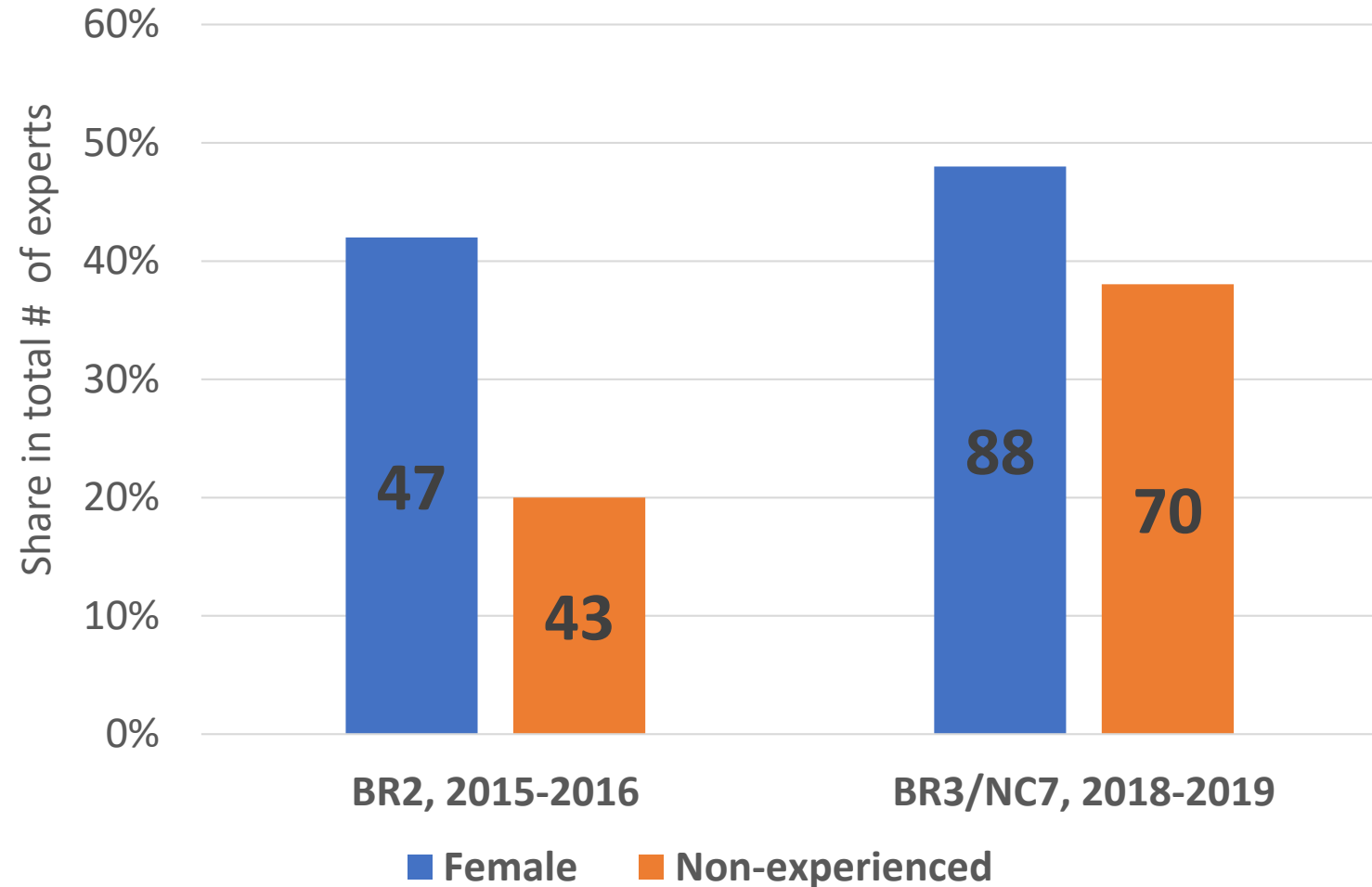


- 184 experts from 76 countries participated in BR3/NC7 reviews 2018-2019.
- 93 from Annex I and 91 from non-Annex I Parties,



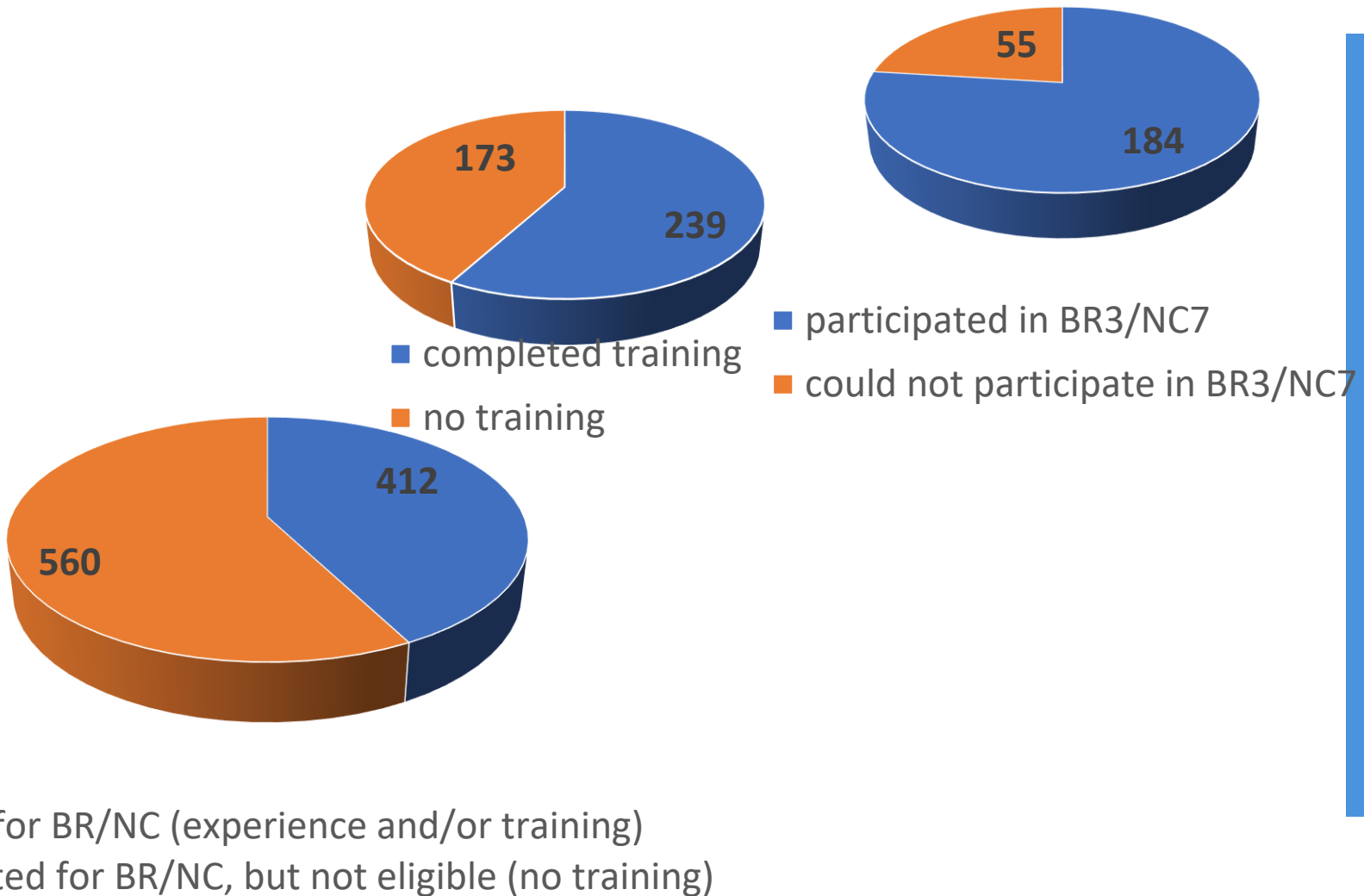
Increased number of new and female experts

- 48% of all experts participating in BR3/NC7 reviews were female (88). Compared to BR2 reviews in 2016-2017 its 6% more.
- 39 % of total experts (70) where took part in BR3/NC7 reviews for the first time.



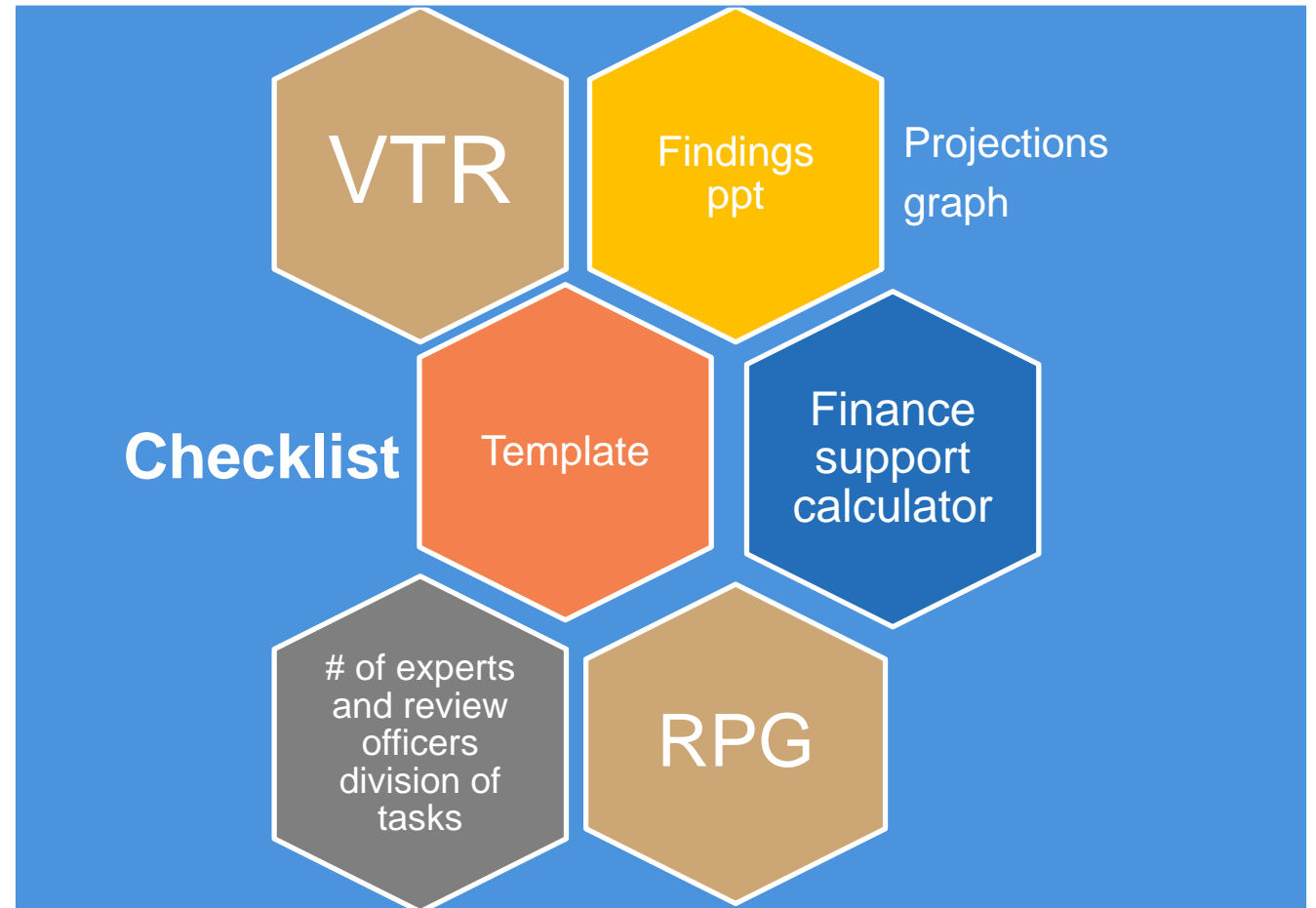
More qualified experts and more support from Parties to experts is needed

- Out of 972 experts nominated for BR/NC, only 42 % (412) are eligible (have experience and/or completed the training programme) and only 25% (239) have completed BR/NC training programme.
- The margin of 55 trained experts is too small to sustain the demand for the future reviews
- More qualified experts are needed to sustain the increasing demand for experts, especially those working on the domestic MRV
- Parties' support for their experts to participate in reviews needs to be secured

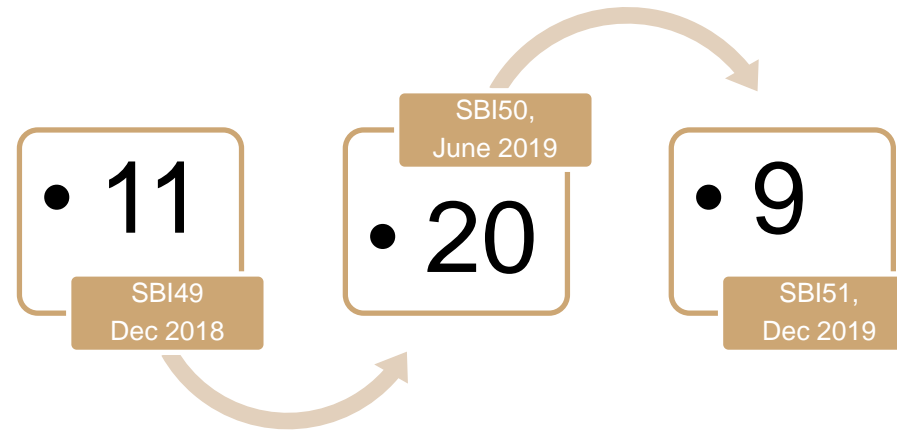


Fine-tuned tools and practices increased efficiency

- Early preparation of the of the BR3/NC7 ERTs, and fine-tuned tools facilitated effectiveness, consistency and efficiency of the reviews.
- In particular, VTR and RPG were found helpful;
- Review report template was challenging at the beginning but helpful afterwards;
- 5-6 experts and 1-2 review officers per Party review was helpful;
- Those approaches and tools could build basis for ETF.



MA - a platform for sharing pre-2020 climate actions and raising ambition beyond
