  - Ideas and concepts integrated in the discussion:
    - the importance of a **just transition** with a gender perspective,
    - the need of **national and local coherence** with international processes,
    - **transparency** as a principle,
    - the **political will** and resources needed for a gender responsive implementation
    - the continuing support to **national focal points**.

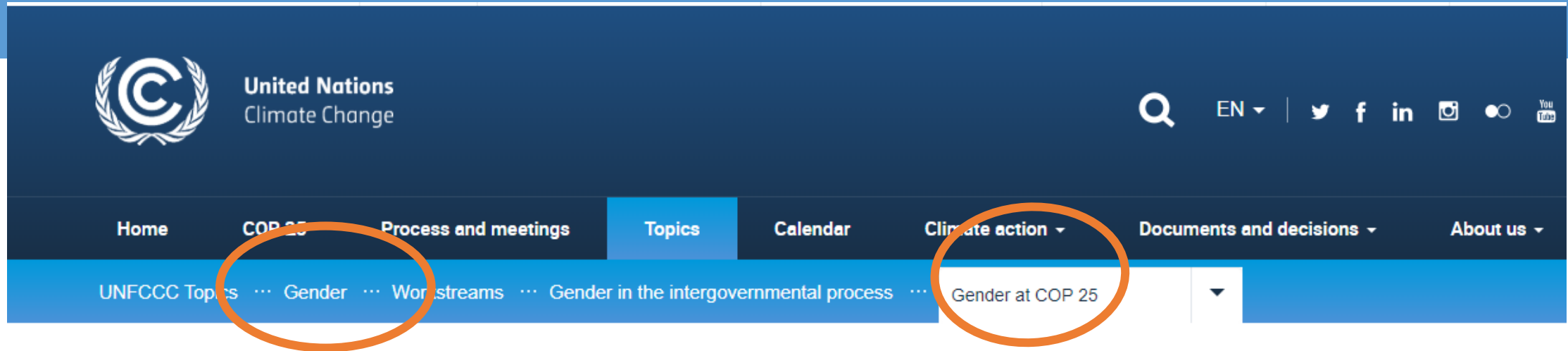


## Day 1: 28 November 2019. Informal technical meeting
