



# Virtual Workshop on Reporting and Review Requirements for Article 6 and Article 13 of the Paris Agreement

### **Background**

Article 6 of the Paris Agreement recognizes that countries may choose to voluntarily cooperate in the implementation of their NDCs to achieve greater ambition in their mitigation and adaptation measures and promote sustainable development and environmental integrity. To achieve this, Article 6 proposes voluntary cooperation mechanisms, such as cooperative approaches, sustainable development mechanisms, and non-market-based approaches.

To participate in Article 6, countries must adjust their national transparency frameworks, comply with the specific requirements of Article 6, and ensure that they track progress towards achieving NDCs and engage in international cooperation. In addition, Article 6 has a component of reporting obligations aligned with the enhanced transparency framework of Article 13, therefore, it is crucial to clarify how both articles are linked, as well as the reporting requirements that must be met.

Currently, countries in Latin America and the Caribbean are developing their first BTR, for delivery by the end of 2024, which presents an opportunity to raise awareness of the reporting requirements under Article 6 that are linked to the enhanced transparency framework of Article 13, and which begins to become effective at the moment when one country decides to participate in the authorization of ITMO to another country.

In response to this context, CBIT-GSP and the UNFCCC Regional Collaborating Centre Latin America (RCC LatAm) are joining forces to conduct a **Practical Training Programme on Reporting under Article 6 and Article 13 of the Paris Agreement** with the overall objective of building countries' technical and institutional capacities to promote transparency of participation in cooperative approaches in the United States. under Article 6, providing tools to follow up on reporting requirements to the UNFCCC.

An <u>introductory webinar</u> was held in April 2024 as an initial activity of the programme, therefore, this virtual workshop is the second activity of the programme and will have a character of deepening the requirements for reporting and review under Article 6 and its relationship with Article 13 of the Paris Agreement.







### **Objective**

Build the technical and institutional capacities of countries members of the <u>Latin America and the Spanish-speaking Caribbean Climate Transparency Network</u> to increase understanding of the reporting requirements and review processes for cooperative approaches under Article 6 and their relationship to Article 13, including tools, guides, examples and elements necessary for the preparation of the initial report and the presentation of annual and regular reporting.

### **Audience and language**

The workshop convenes the CBIT-GSP focal points and thematic experts related to climate transparency from the Climate Transparency Network, as well as other experts and stakeholders related to cooperative approaches to Article 6 of the Paris Agreement. The virtual workshop will include speakers from the UNFCCC RCC Latin America.

The virtual workshop will be held in **Spanish**.
