**Please describe how your country's participation in the Article 6.4 mechanism contributes to sustainable development, while acknowledging that the consideration of sustainable development is a national prerogative.**

Mongolia considers participation in the Article 6.4 mechanism as a strategic instrument to advance sustainable development by mobilizing climate finance, facilitating technology transfer, and enabling private sector engagement, in line with the Paris Agreement and national development priorities.

*Article 6.4 activities are expected to contribute to:*

- Implementation of Mongolia's Nationally Determined Contribution (NDC 3.0, 2025–2035), including mitigation outcomes and associated sustainable development co-benefits;
- Reduction of greenhouse gas emissions across all sectors;
- Achievement of national development priorities and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

These contributions are aligned with Mongolia's national development framework, including the Sustainable Development Vision 2030, which integrates the SDGs into national policy and establishes national indicators and monitoring systems for sustainable development. Sustainable development considerations are further embedded in Mongolia's climate policy framework, including the NDC.

*Article 6.4 activities in Mongolia are expected to contribute to the following priorities:*

- Expansion of renewable energy and reduction of reliance on coal-based energy;
- Promotion of energy efficiency and deployment of low-carbon technologies;
- Improvement of air quality as a co-benefit of mitigation actions, particularly in urban areas;
- Support for sustainable agriculture, including climate-resilient livestock and rangeland management;
- Contribution to green job creation and sustainable economic development;
- Enhancement of climate resilience and adaptive capacity.

Mongolia will ensure that Article 6.4 activities are implemented in accordance with applicable national regulations and relevant requirements under the Article 6.4 mechanism.

*Activities shall:*

- Ensure environmental integrity;
- Respect environmental and social considerations;
- Include stakeholder consultation, as applicable;
- Promote transparency and accountability.

These considerations are aligned with the requirements of the Article 6.4 mechanism under the UNFCCC.

*Sustainable Development Assessment:*

This approach builds on existing national systems, including Mongolia's Sustainable Development Vision 2030, the national SDG indicator and monitoring system, and relevant elements of NDC implementation and reporting frameworks submitted to the UNFCCC.

Mongolia would consider approving Article 6, paragraph 4 (A6.4) activities that are consistent with the Rules, Modalities and Procedures of the Article 6.4 mechanism, Mongolia's national laws and regulations, its Nationally Determined Contribution (NDC 3.0), and national sustainable development priorities.

*Mongolia may consider approving A6.4 activities across the sectors covered by its NDC 3.0, including:*

- **Energy (energy industries and energy consumption):**  
Activities that contribute to emission reductions in energy generation and energy consumption sectors, including renewable energy and energy efficiency measures, consistent with Mongolia's NDC 3.0
- **Transport (energy consumption):**  
Activities that reduce emissions from the transport sector, including improvements in energy efficiency and deployment of lower-emission transport systems;
- **Industrial processes and product use (IPPU):**  
Activities that reduce emissions from industrial processes and product use, in line with sectoral coverage under Mongolia's NDC 3.0;
- **Agriculture:**  
Activities that reduce emissions from livestock and agricultural practices, including measures to improve livestock productivity and sustainable land and pasture management;
- **Waste:**  
Activities that reduce emissions from solid waste and wastewater management systems;
- **Forestry and other land use (LULUCF):**  
Activities that enhance removals and carbon sequestration, including afforestation, reforestation, and forest related activities, consistent with national accounting approaches reflected in Mongolia's NDC 3.0.

Mongolia may also consider activities that generate mitigation outcomes alongside sustainable development and adaptation co-benefits, where consistent with Article 6.4 rules and approved methodologies. All activities will be required to demonstrate additionality, ensure environmental integrity, and be consistent with Mongolia's NDC implementation.

*Contribution to Mongolia's NDC:*

The above A6.4 activities and their associated emission reductions or removals are expected to contribute to the implementation of Mongolia's NDC 3.0 by supporting mitigation actions across all sectors covered under the NDC.

Mongolia's NDC 3.0 covers all greenhouse gases and sectors, including energy, industrial processes and product use, agriculture, waste, and forestry and other land use.

*Mongolia aims to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by:*

- 30.3% by 2035 through unconditional measures;
- Up to 52.8% with conditional measures, compared to the business-as-usual scenario.

Emission reductions and removals generated by A6.4 activities may contribute to Mongolia's NDC where such outcomes are retained for domestic use. Where emission reductions are authorized for international transfer, Mongolia will account for such outcomes in accordance with relevant Article 6 guidance, including the application of corresponding adjustments, as applicable.

*Contribution to Long-term Strategies and Paris Agreement Goals:*

Mongolia is currently in the process of developing its Long Term Low Emission Development Strategy (LT-LEDS).

The country would follow the approved baseline methodologies and additionality requirements as per the RMPs agreed by the SBM and CMA guidelines.

Mongolia is currently developing draft Climate Change Law and a national carbon market framework, including implementation guidelines and a roadmap, to guide the country's participation in Article 6 of the Paris Agreement. As part of this process, Mongolia is preparing positive and negative lists of activities for Article 6, which will define eligible and non-eligible mitigation activities and support alignment with the implementation of its NDC 3.0.
