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Agenda item 1. Agenda and meeting organization

Agenda item 1.1. Opening

1. Mr. Mkhuthazi Steleki, Chair of the Supervisory Body of the mechanism established by Article 6, paragraph 4, of the Paris Agreement (Article 6.4 mechanism), opened the meeting and asserted that the quorum requirement was met.

Agenda item 1.2. Adoption of the agenda

3. The Supervisory Body adopted the agenda of the meeting, which was published as document A6.4-SBM021-AA.²

Agenda item 2. Governance and management matters

Agenda item 2.1. Membership issues

4. Members and alternate members of the Supervisory Body made available statements of actual, potential or perceived conflicts of interest with respect to the issues on the agenda of this meeting, as reflected on the UNFCCC website.³

Agenda item 2.2. Strategic planning and direction

5. The Supervisory Body took note that no matters related to strategic planning and direction were considered at this meeting.

Agenda item 2.3. Performance management

6. The Supervisory Body took note of the update on the financial status of the 2026-2027 Business and Resource Allocation Plan (RAP) and requested the secretariat to continue to provide regular updates on the income and expenditures.
7. The Supervisory Body requested the secretariat to continue its review of Article 6.4 budget and, as appropriate, to develop proposals for further adjustments, taking into account resource constraints. Such proposals should include an assessment of their potential impact, with a view to ensuring that available resources are allocated to activities of the highest priority;
8. The Supervisory Body took note of its updated workplan 2026 and requested the secretariat to include any new mandates arising from future meetings in subsequent iterations of the workplan, and to provide an update on the status of work on a regular basis.
9. The Supervisory Body took note of the updated workplan of the Methodological Expert Panel (MEP) for 2026 and requested the secretariat to include any new mandates from the Supervisory Body in future versions of the workplan, and to provide an update on the status of work on a regular basis.

Agenda item 2.4. Matters related to the Supervisory Body and its support structure

10. The Supervisory Body took note of the report of the seventh meeting of the Accreditation Expert Panel (AEP).⁴ The report summarized the work of the AEP, including an update on applications received from applicant entities (AEs) for accreditation under the Article 6.4 mechanism.
11. The Supervisory Body took note of the report of the twelfth and thirteenth meetings of the MEP.⁵ The reports summarize the work of the MEP, including the products related to requirements for the methodologies, activities involving removals, and the revision of clean development mechanism (CDM) methodologies and methodological tools

Agenda item 2.5. Designated national authorities

12. The Supervisory Body took note that 127 designated national authorities were established as of 21 May 2026, and 55 countries submitted information on the fulfilment of the host Party participation requirements.⁶

Agenda item 3. Regulatory and procedural matters

Agenda item 3.1. Governance

13. The Supervisory Body took note of the information on actions implemented by the secretariat in support of the MEP.
14. The Supervisory Body considered the information note “Transparency arrangements for the operations of Article 6.4 expert panels”, as contained in annex 1 to this report, and noted both the potential benefits and risks associated with additional live-streaming of panel meetings and agreed to keep the current practice. The Supervisory Body may revisit this, at future meetings, considering further substantive experience and developments.
15. Further, to enhance the transparency of meeting proceedings of the expert panels while safeguarding the productivity of their work, the Supervisory Body requested the secretariat to implement the following measures, as appropriate, in consultation with the Chair and Vice-Chair of the Supervisory Body and the co-chairs of its expert panels, in consideration of financial resources:
 - (a) Continue organizing public webinars on recommendations from and further work to be undertaken by the MEP;
 - (b) Continue organizing teleconferences to update the designated operational entities (DOEs) and AEs on relevant AEP and MEP products;

- (c) Use additional communication tools such as op-eds by the Chair and Vice-Chair of the Supervisory Body or co-chairs of its expert panels, as applicable, on specific topics;
 - (d) Upload the presentations delivered during the briefing session between MEP and the Supervisory Body members on the UNFCCC website; and
 - (e) Inform stakeholders by updating the website, of the possibility to provide input (e.g. technical papers, peer-reviewed studies) as appropriate via email communication.⁷
16. While the matters related to transparency arrangements for the expert panels was considered by the Supervisory Body, as referred to in paragraph 15 above, the Supervisory Body requested the secretariat to prepare a separate concept note addressing governance issues for the expert panels and the Supervisory Body, including conflict of interest, code of conduct, confidentiality, and the selection and re-selection of expert panel members, as mandated at SBM 018⁸ and 020, respectively.

Agenda item 3.2. Accreditation

17. The Supervisory Body considered the recommendation of the AEP and decided the following:
- (a) To approve the clarification concerning paragraph 96 of the “Standard: Article 6.4 Accreditation”, version 02.0 as below:
 - (i) paragraph 96 of the “Standard: Article 6.4 accreditation”, version 02.0, should be read as follows:
 - (ii) [...] the DOE shall not sign a contract with a project developer, financier or consultant with whom there is a conflict of interest. If the activity has only one Activity Participant authorized by the Host Party and Participating Party, and this Activity Participant is also a project developer, financier or consultant with whom a conflict of interest exists, this Activity Participant will need to identify another Activity Participant who is not such project developer, financier or consultant; and
 - (b) To request the secretariat to incorporate the clarification into a future revision of the “Standard: Article 6.4 Accreditation”.

Agenda item 3.3. Activity cycle

18. The Supervisory Body considered the “Information note on the possible cases, and modalities for which the Supervisory Body might consider deregistration of activities”. The Supervisory Body acknowledged the merits of introducing a deregistration process in the Article 6.4 activity cycle. However, it noted that introduction of such a process requires a mandate from the CMA. Therefore, the Supervisory Body agreed to request such a mandate in a future annual report to the CMA.

19. The Supervisory Body considered the draft “Tool: Article 6.4 sustainable development tool version 02.0 (A6.4 SD tool)” and requested the secretariat to launch an additional call for input on the draft tool “A6.4 SD tool”⁹ for two weeks. The Supervisory Body further requested the secretariat to:
- (a) Present, at the twenty-third meeting (SBM 023), a summary of the inputs received through the additional call for input;
 - (b) Present the expected budget cost for the potential development of web-based forms for A6.4-FORM-AC-015, A6.4-FORM-AC-016, and A6.4-FORM-AC-017 at its twenty-third meeting (SBM 023);
 - (c) Prepare a summary of responses to input received at SBM 021 and through the additional call for input;
 - (d) Provide inputs on the potential revision of the review cycle for the Article 6.4 sustainable development tool; and
 - (e) Present a revised SD tool, incorporating the inputs mentioned in (c) and (d), for consideration at its first meeting in 2027.

Agenda item 3.4. Methodologies

20. The Supervisory Body adopted the “A6.4-AMT-008: Methodological tool: Analysis of lock-in risk”, as contained in annex 2 to this report. The Supervisory Body agreed to request the MEP to further work on a revision of the “A6.4-AMT-008: Methodological tool: Analysis of lock-in risk” to include Article 6.4 activities involving retrofit, refurbishment and the addition of new components to existing facilities.
21. The Supervisory Body adopted the revision to the “Standard: Demonstration of additionality in mechanism methodologies”, as contained in annex 3 to this report.
22. The Supervisory Body adopted the “A6.4-AMT-009: Methodological tool: Fraction of non-renewable biomass”, as contained in annex 4 to this report.
23. The Supervisory Body further agreed to mandate the MEP to:
- (a) Revise the “A6.4-AMT-009: Methodological tool: Fraction of non-renewable biomass” as soon as possible to:
 - (i) include default values for fraction of non-renewable (fNRB) for further countries; and
 - (ii) conduct further analysis of the potential to apply the Modelling Fuelwood Saving Scenarios default scenarios version or user-defined scenarios version; and
 - (b) Revise the methodological tool once new data and methods to calculate the fNRB become available and update the uncertainty estimates of the default values for fNRB not later than three years after initial adoption of the methodological tool.

24. The Supervisory Body adopted the “Mechanism methodology: N₂O abatement from nitric acid production”, as contained in annex 5 to this report.
25. The Supervisory Body approved the clarification prepared by the MEP in response to the request for clarification “A6.4-AMM-CLA-001: Applicability of A6.4-AMM-001 for landfill projects with pre-existing passive gas collection system”.¹⁰
26. In addition, the Supervisory Body agreed to request the MEP to:
 - (a) Revise the mechanism methodology “A6.4-AMM-001: Flaring or use of landfill gas” to incorporate the clarification as mentioned in paragraph 25 above following the decision by the Supervisory Body; and
 - (b) Align the mechanism methodology with the other regulatory documents approved by the Supervisory Body.
27. Furthermore, the Supervisory Body requested the MEP to:
 - (a) Prepare the “Concept note: Revision of methodological standards and tools for application to programmes of activities”, noting the Supervisory Body’s earlier mandate to address large-scale crediting programmes;¹¹ and
 - (b) Revise any relevant methodological standards and tools to make them applicable to programmes of activities, including, inter alia, the following documents:
 - (i) “Standard: Setting the baseline in mechanism methodologies” (A6.4-STAN-METH-004);¹²
 - (ii) “Standard: Demonstration of additionality in mechanism methodologies” (A6.4-STAN-METH-003);¹³
 - (iii) “Standard: Addressing leakage in mechanism methodologies” (A6.4-STAN-METH-005);¹⁴
 - (iv) “Standard: Addressing suppressed demand in mechanism methodologies” (A6.4-STAN-METH-006);¹⁵
 - (v) “Standard: Addressing non-permanence and reversals in mechanism methodologies” (A6.4-STAN-METH-007);¹⁶
 - (vi) “Methodological tool: Common practice analysis” (A6.4-AMT-001);¹⁷ and

(vii) “Methodological tool: Investment analysis” (A6.4-AMT-002).¹⁸

28. Furthermore the Supervisory Body requested the secretariat, in consultation with the MEP, to prepare revised versions of procedures, standards and tools, inter alia, of the following documents to incorporate any provisions necessary for the implementation of requirements relating to non-permanence and reversals, while not prejudging the outcome of the consideration of the “Draft mechanism methodology: Energy-efficiency measures in household cooking”:
- (a) “Procedure: Article 6.4 mechanism registry” (A6.4-PROC-REGS-001);¹⁹
 - (b) “Procedure: Article 6.4 activity cycle procedure for projects” (A6.4-PROC-AC-002);²⁰ and
 - (c) “Procedure: Article 6.4 activity cycle procedure for programmes of activities” (A6.4-PROC-AC-003).²¹
29. The Supervisory Body requested the secretariat, in consultation with the MEP, to prepare a revised version of the “Procedure for development, revision and clarification of methodologies and methodological tools” for consideration by the Supervisory Body at a future meeting, with a view to clarifying areas of the current procedure in light of lessons learned and experience gained by the MEP and the secretariat in the development of methodologies and tools in recent years, and incorporating provisions necessary to operationalize deviations as envisaged under the approved activity cycle procedure.

Agenda item 3.5. Registry

30. The Supervisory Body considered the “Procedure: Article 6.4 mechanism registry”, as contained in annex 4 to the annotated agenda and requested the secretariat to:
- (a) Prepare a revised procedure, taking into account the discussion at this meeting;
 - (b) Launch a call for public input, using the revised version of the procedure mentioned above; and
 - (c) Present a revised procedure, taking into account public inputs and discussion at this meeting, for consideration by the Supervisory Body at the next meeting.
31. The Supervisory Body considered the updated concept note on “Considerations for repurposing the voluntary cancellation platform” and agreed to continue considering this matter at SBM 022 with a view to having an agreed outcome.

Agenda item 3.6. Policy matters

32. The Supervisory Body took note that no policy matters were considered at this meeting.

Agenda item 4. Rulings

Agenda item 4.1. Accreditation

33. The Supervisory Body considered the recommendation of the AEP and agreed to accredit for five years the following applicant entities:
- (a) A6.4E-0011 “Safecarbon Credit Carbon Intermediation Ltd.” (Safecarbon) for validation, verification and certification functions for sectoral scopes 14 and 15 in accordance with paragraph 86(a) of the “Procedure: A6.4 accreditation” (version 02.0);
 - (b) A6.4E-0016 “Enviance Services Private Limited” (Enviance) for validation, verification and certification functions for sectoral scopes 1–10 and 12–16 in accordance with paragraph 86(a) of the “Procedure: A6.4 accreditation” (version 02.0); and
 - (c) A6.4E-0017 “TÜV NORD CERT GmbH” (TNCert) for validation, verification and certification functions for sectoral scopes 1–15 in accordance with paragraph 86(a) of the “Procedure: A6.4 accreditation” (version. 02.0).

Agenda item 4.2. Registration

34. The Supervisory Body noted that no transition requests were considered at this meeting.

Agenda item 4.3. Issuance

35. The Supervisory Body noted that no issuance rulings were considered at this meeting.

Agenda item 4.4. Other rulings

36. The Supervisory Body noted that no other rulings were considered at this meeting.

Agenda item 5. Relation with forums and other stakeholders

37. The Supervisory Body took note of the preparations of the side-event to be held in Bonn at the sixty-fourth sessions of the Subsidiary Bodies.
38. The Supervisory Body took note and welcomed the secretariat's new capacity-building initiatives, in particular the online knowledge products and Article 6 Academy, noting the scale of their outreach and the diversity of stakeholders engaged. The Supervisory Body appreciated the work delivered and encouraged the secretariat to sustain and build upon these efforts, including by expanding the portfolio of knowledge products—particularly in additional languages—pursuing academic partnerships, strengthening country engagement, and developing Train-the-Trainer programmes. The Supervisory Body also invited the secretariat to periodically inform Article 6.4 DNAs and Parties about the available training materials and knowledge products, available at the Article 6 Capacity Building website.²²

39. The Supervisory Body interacted with registered observers during the meeting. The observers presented views in relation to items on the agenda of this meeting. The Supervisory Body took note of the inputs and thanked the observers for their interaction. The list of registered observers to this meeting is contained in annex 6 to this report.
40. The Supervisory Body also interacted with Mr. Javier Castro, chair of the DOE/AE Coordination Forum during its meeting and took note of the Forum's input. The Supervisory Body thanked the chair for his input.
41. The Supervisory Body considered the letters submitted by stakeholders and agreed to respond in accordance with the "Procedure: Direct communication with stakeholders".²³
42. The Supervisory Body agreed to send a letter to the ICAO secretariat to request an update on the status of the information note²⁴ and the accompanying letter sent on 22 September 2025²⁵.
43. The Supervisory Body considered public comments on the documentation of this meeting, which were made publicly available on the UNFCCC website, and thanked stakeholders for their comments.²⁶
44. Observers to SBM 022 shall register with the secretariat three weeks before the start of that meeting. Any change to the meeting date will be communicated as appropriate.

Agenda item 6. Other matters

45. The Supervisory Body agreed to the provisional agenda for SBM 022, to be held in Bonn, from 27 to 30 July 2026, as contained in annex 7 to this report.
46. The Supervisory Body agreed to extend the meeting dates for SBM 023 by one day, from 5 to 9 October 2026, as contained in annex 8 to this report.

Agenda item 7. Conclusion of the meeting

47. The Chair summarized the main conclusions.
