Workstream 1: Promoting collaboration with the constituted bodies, partner organizations of the Nairobi work programme, and others

Participate, as mandated or if invited and prioritized by AC members, in expert groups and events of other constituted bodies or workstreams under the Convention and the Paris Agreement.

- Implement NAP TF workplan, incl. on addressing gaps and needs
- NWP event on MEL systems for all adaptation actions and support, including transformational adaptation
- Adequacy and effectiveness of adaptation and support
