I: AC technical paper on adaptation technologies

- AC technical paper on "Priorities and needs: technologies for adaptation in agriculture, water resources and coastal zones; including experiences in stakeholder engagement and regulatory issues pertaining to the development, transfer and uptake of technologies in those sectors"
- ❖ The draft technical paper includes two main substantive chapters: one from the perspective of adaptation planning and one from the perspective of implementation.
- Sub-themes include technology transfer, stakeholder engagement, regulatory issues, innovative approaches, and good practices, and good practices, gaps, needs, and challenges.



II: Progress and next steps

The next iteration will, among other things:

- Integrate further research materials;
- Incorporate quantitative analyses and insights;
- ❖ Integrate further case studies, ensuring regional balance;
- Include sections on indigenous knowledge/technologies and gender-sensitive and -responsive approaches;
- Complete sections now represented by placeholders; and
- Incorporate insights from relevant events (such as this one).



II: Key messages – preliminary insights

- Adaptation technologies in the agriculture sector are in very high demand, as highlighted clearly and frequently in TNAs, NAPs, NDCs, and ADCOMs
- ❖ These include various types of hardware, software, and orgware
- ❖ Related gaps, challenges, and needs are increasingly pressing, and relate to e.g. capacity-building to deploy specific technologies, research and innovation, etc.
- ❖ There is a growing landscape of innovative adaptation technologies and approaches, including for agriculture; it is critical that this innovation benefits all
