### INFORMAL NOTE BY THE CO-FACILITATORS on

This informal note has been prepared by the co-facilitators under their own responsibility. The content of this note is preliminary, has not been agreed, is not exhaustive and has no formal status. It is intended to assist Parties in advancing discussions on this matter and does not prejudge further work or prevent Parties from expressing their views at any time.

### Draft proposal for two draft decisions: decision -/CP.29 and decision -/CMA.6

A - Text to be included in <u>both</u> draft decisions:

1. *Takes note* of the 2023 report of the Adaptation Committee;<sup>1</sup>

2. *Welcomes* the 2024 report of the Adaptation Committee;<sup>2</sup>

3. *Also welcomes* the progress of the Adaptation Committee in implementing its flexible workplan for 2022–2024;<sup>3</sup>

4. *Takes note* of the flexible workplan of the Adaptation Committee for 2025–2027;<sup>4</sup>

5. *Invites* relevant constituted bodies, representatives of institutional arrangements under the Convention and the Paris Agreement, Parties and non-Party stakeholders, as appropriate, to use relevant findings from Adaptation Committee publications and events, such as the following, in their work:

(a) Report on 30 years of adaptation under the United Nations climate change process;<sup>5</sup>

(b) Policy brief on the application of traditional knowledge, knowledge of Indigenous Peoples and local knowledge systems to adaptation action;<sup>6</sup>

(c) Toolkit for monitoring, evaluation and learning for national adaptation plan processes;<sup>7</sup>

(d) The 2024 Adaptation Forum;<sup>8</sup>

(e) Training sessions for developing country Parties on addressing identified gaps and needs related to the process to formulate and implement NAPs, held jointly with the LEG during the 2024 NAP Expo;<sup>9</sup>

6. *Notes with appreciation* the continued efforts of the Adaptation Committee to promote the implementation of enhanced adaptation action in a coherent manner, including in collaboration with other constituted bodies, including through its NAP taskforce, and with partners of the Nairobi work programme on impacts, vulnerability and adaptation to climate change;

7. *Requests* the Adaptation Committee to organize further training sessions for developing country Parties on addressing identified gaps and needs related to the process to formulate and implement NAPs;

8. *Invites* the Adaptation Committee to continue efforts to address the capacity-building needs of developing countries, including at the regional level, in relation to accessing adaptation finance;

9. *Welcomes* the portal of interactive country profiles<sup>10</sup> containing information on adaptation action reported by Parties under the Convention and the Paris Agreement and *requests* the secretariat to regularly update the portal and make available online training material on how to use it;

10. *Encourages* the Adaptation Committee to continue its regional engagement with a view to enhancing the sharing of relevant information, knowledge, experiences and good practices and improving the dissemination, understanding and use of its technical products by organizations and practitioners within and outside the Convention and the Paris Agreement process and in all geographical regions;<sup>11</sup>

11. *Reiterates* the encouragement for the Adaptation Committee to make further use of communication in languages other than English;<sup>12</sup>

12. *Takes note* of the estimated budgetary implications of the activities to be undertaken by the secretariat referred to in paragraphs 4, 6, 9 and 11 above;

13. *Requests* that the actions of the secretariat called for in this decision be undertaken subject to the availability of financial resources.

### B – Text relating to the Paris Agreement to be added to decision -/CMA.6:

14. *Welcomes* the contribution<sup>13</sup> of the Adaptation Committee to the compilation and mapping of indicators relevant to measuring progress towards the targets referred to in paragraphs 9–10 of decision 2/CMA.5, namely its identification of information on indicators reported by Parties in their national reports and communications in the context of the work referred to in paragraph 45 of decision 2/CMA.5;<sup>14</sup>

15. Urges the Adaptation Committee to continue or expedite its mandated work on:

(a) Compiling existing methodologies for reviewing the adequacy and effectiveness of adaptation and support;<sup>15</sup>

(b) Providing guidance to the secretariat to prepare regular synthesis reports in the context of recognizing adaptation efforts of developing countries;<sup>16</sup>

(c) Supporting the implementation of the United Arab Emirates Framework for Global Climate Resilience with technical guidance and training materials thereon;<sup>17</sup>

(d) Developing recommendations on how to improve reporting on adaptation action and progress, including with a view to informing the review and update, as appropriate, of the modalities, procedures and guidelines for the transparency framework for action and support referred to in Article 13 of the Paris Agreement<sup>18</sup> and the review of the training course referred to in paragraph 10 of decision 9/CMA.4.<sup>19</sup>
