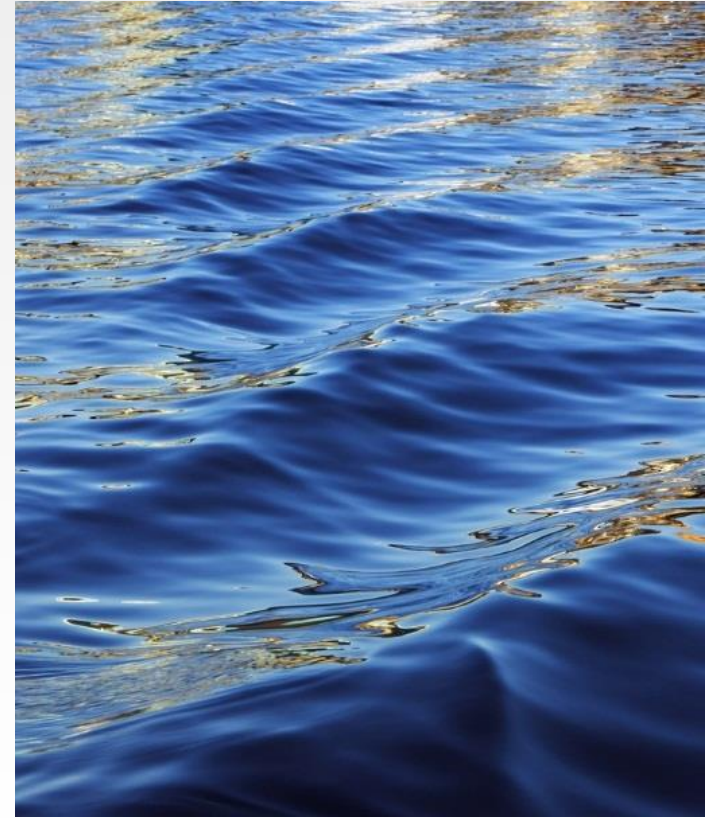

**Adaptation Fund – supporting
concrete, scalable projects**



Experience on funding Climate Adaptation

Since inception, the Fund has mobilized 755 million US dollars in resources. **US\$ 199 million came from CER proceeds and US\$ 538 million from developed countries' contributions.**

The resources allocated so far amount to **US\$ 532 million in 81 countries, of which 28 are LDCs and 18 SIDS.**

The Adaptation Fund currently funds 80 concrete, localized adaptation and resilience projects in 63 vulnerable countries with **ca. 5.8 million direct beneficiaries.** Its projects are effective, flexible and scalable, and can be replicated in other communities.

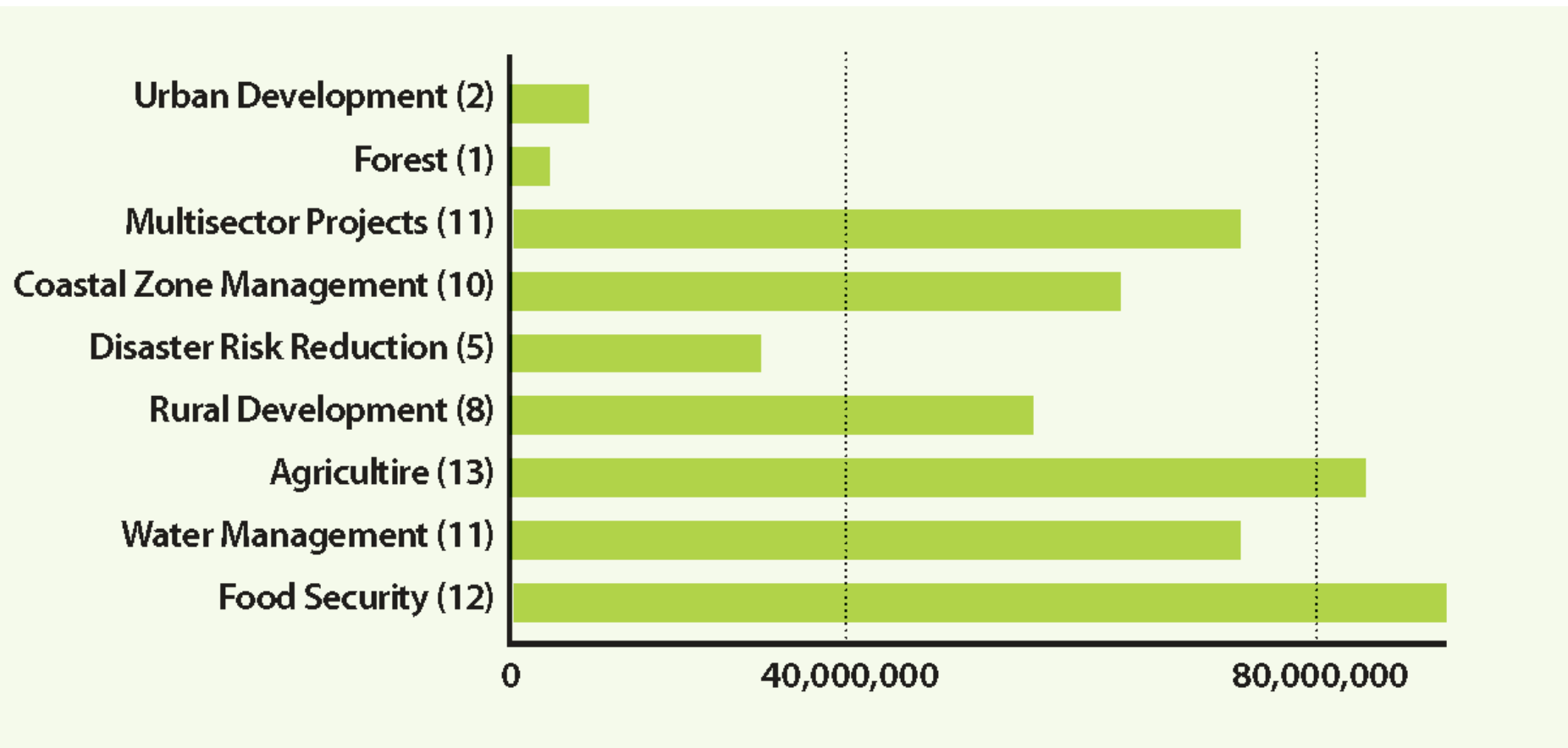
Since 2010 the Fund has approved US\$ 532 million for 81 countries



- Projects under development (October 2018):
 - 25 country project totaling US\$ 96.0 million
 - 22 regional projects totaling US\$ 203.1 million

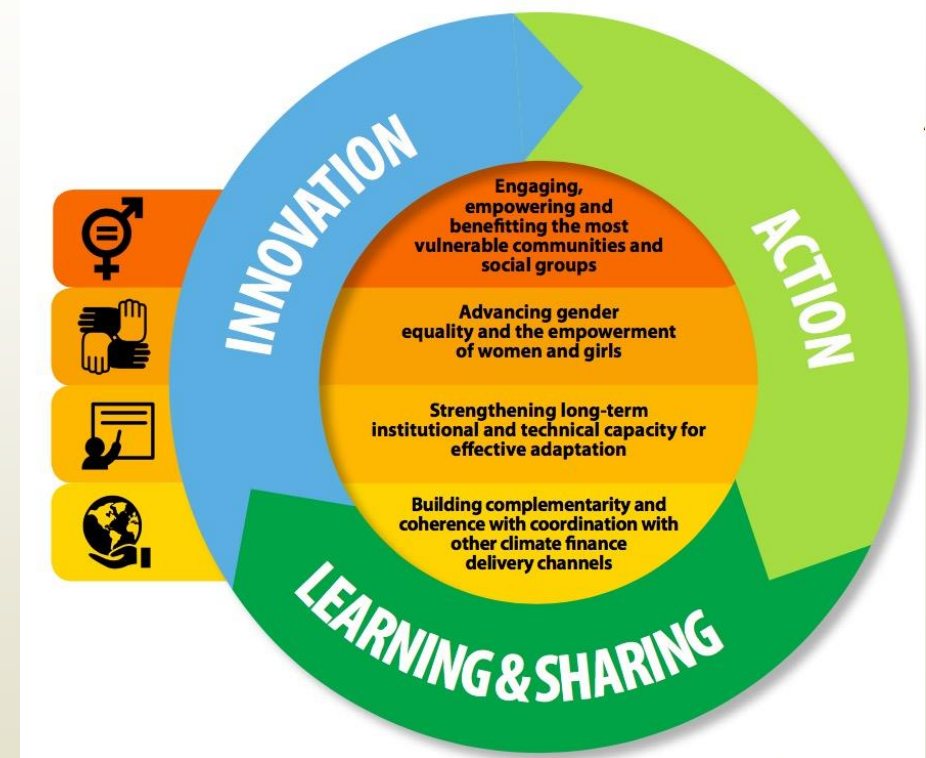
Food security and agriculture are two largest sectors in Adaptation Fund portfolio

Adaptation Fund Medium-term Strategy (MTS)

- Focus on 3 pillars:
 - concrete **action**,
 - **innovative** approaches to climate finance
 - valuable **learning**
- WFP Ecuador project embodies these principles:
 - Concrete: improved water access for 3,700 and water consumption for 2,200 families; 4,800 farmers implement sustainable agricultural practices
 - New approaches: pioneered generation of information visualizing vulnerability of communities in terms of climate hazards
 - Knowledge: indigenous knowledge incorporated in local plans



- Also:
 - Focus on the **vulnerable** (malnutrition)
 - Active participation of **women** in vulnerability analysis, adaptation planning

Adaptation Fund projects in agriculture (examples)

- Morocco: Climate change adaptation project in oasis zones
 - Rebuilding, enhancing and expanding ancient “khettara” rain and groundwater collection system (built in 1st century CE)
- Implemented by Agency for Agricultural Development of Morocco
- Mongolia: Ecosystem Based Adaptation Approach to Maintaining Water Security in Critical Water Catchments in Mongolia
 - Efficient use of dwindling water resources for agriculture and households
 - Diversification of livelihoods
- Implemented by UNDP
