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Administrative, financial and institutional matters

Draft conclusions proposed by the Chair

1. The Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI) took note of the information contained in the documents on administrative, financial and institutional matters.¹
2. The SBI recommended that the Conference of the Parties (COP) at its thirtieth session (November 2025) approve a core programme budget of EUR xx,xxx,xxx for the biennium 2026–2027.
3. The SBI authorized the Executive Secretary to notify Parties of their 2026 contributions on the basis of the budget amount shown in paragraph 2 above after taking into account the special annual contribution from the Host Government of EUR 766,938.
4. The SBI recommended a draft decision on this matter for consideration and adoption at COP 30 and two draft decisions on this matter for consideration and adoption by the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol at its twentieth session (November 2025) (for the text of the draft decisions, see document FCCC/SBI/2025/L.x/Add.1–3).

Administrative, financial and institutional matters

The Conference of the Parties,

Recalling the UNFCCC financial procedures, in particular paragraph 5,²

Further recalling Article 8, paragraph 2(f), of the Convention and Article 17, paragraph 2, of the Paris Agreement,

Having considered the information contained in the documents prepared by the secretariat on administrative, financial and institutional matters for this session, including the proposed programme budget for the biennium 2026–2027,³

Noting with appreciation the methodology applied by the secretariat in developing the programme budget for the biennium 2026–2027, including the early engagement with Parties and implementation of recommendations from the United Nations Board of Auditors,

I. Programme budget for the biennium 2026–2027

1. *Approves* the programme budget for the biennium 2026–2027, amounting to EUR xx,xxx,xxx, for the purposes specified in table 1;
2. *Requests* the secretariat, in implementing its work programme for the biennium 2026–2027 based on the budget approved in paragraph 1 above, to seek to allocate adequate resources to constituted bodies in support of their response to the mandates from the governing bodies and to the full delivery of their work programmes, to transparency (including the enhanced transparency framework under the Paris Agreement) and to adaptation-related activities, while continuing to apply the established budget methodology, including to any new mandate;
3. *Notes with appreciation* the annual contribution of EUR 766,938 from the Host Government to the core budget;
4. *Approves* the staffing table (table 2) for the programme budget;
5. *Notes* that the programme budget contains elements relating to the Convention and the Paris Agreement, as well as the Kyoto Protocol;
6. *Adopts* the indicative scale of contributions contained in the annex;
7. *Notes* that the indicative scale of contributions covers 98 per cent of the contributions specified in table 1;
8. *Invites* the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol, at its twentieth session (November 2025), to endorse the elements of the approved budget as it applies to the Kyoto Protocol;
9. *Also invites* the United Nations General Assembly to continue to provide resources for conference services from its regular budget;
10. *Approves* a contingency budget for conference services, amounting to EUR 11,679,400, to be added to the programme budget in the event that the United Nations General Assembly does not provide resources for these activities in the United Nations regular budget (see table 3);
11. *Requests* the Executive Secretary to report to the Subsidiary Body for Implementation on the implementation of the matters referred to in paragraphs 9–10 above, as necessary;
12. *Authorizes* the Executive Secretary to make transfers between each of the appropriation lines set out in table 1, up to an aggregate limit of 15 per cent of total estimated expenditure for those appropriation lines, provided that a further limitation of up to minus 25 per cent of each such appropriation line shall apply, while ensuring no negative impacts on the activities under each division;
13. *Decides* to maintain the level of the working capital reserve at 8.3 per cent of the estimated expenditure;
14. *Takes note* of the funding estimates of EUR 16.2 million for the trust fund for participation in the UNFCCC process and EUR xxx.x million for the trust fund for supplementary activities for the biennium 2026–2027;
15. *Invites* Parties to make contributions to the trust funds mentioned in paragraph 14 above;
16. *Recalls* its decision that Parties are to seek to approve future core budgets that include all category 1 (essential) and 2 (long-term, recurring) activities that have been mandated by the Conference of the Parties and the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement;⁴
17. *Notes with appreciation* the efforts of the secretariat to implement efficiency measures and engage Parties early in the development of the programme budget for the biennium 2026–

2027, and *requests* the secretariat to further enhance its efforts in identifying and implementing efficiency gains;

18. *Requests* the Executive Secretary to propose to the Conference of the Parties at its thirty-first session (November 2026) any necessary adjustments to the programme budget for the biennium 2026–2027, supported by a report on income and budget performance for 1 January to 30 June 2026;

II. Budget performance for the biennium 2024–2025

19. *Takes note* of the information contained in the documents on the budget performance for the biennium 2024–2025,⁵ the updated work programme of the secretariat for the biennium 2024–2025⁶ and the status of contributions and fees as at 30 May 2025;⁷
20. *Expresses appreciation* to Parties that made contributions to the core budget in a timely manner;
21. *Expresses concern* regarding the high level of outstanding contributions to the core budget⁸ for the current and previous bienniums, which has resulted in difficulties with cash flow and the effective implementation of activities;
22. *Strongly urges* Parties that have not made contributions in full to the core budget for the current and/or previous bienniums to do so without further delay;
23. *Expresses appreciation* for the contributions to the trust fund for participation in the UNFCCC process and to the trust fund for supplementary activities received from Parties, including those contributions that allow for greater flexibility in allocation;
24. *Reiterates appreciation* to the Government of Germany for its special contribution of EUR 1,789,522 as Host Government of the secretariat;
25. *Requests* the Executive Secretary to take further measures to reduce Parties' outstanding contributions;

III. Other financial and budgetary matters

26. *Takes note* of the information contained in the documents prepared by the secretariat on other financial and budgetary matters, including on efforts to further improve the efficiency and transparency of the UNFCCC budget process;⁹ 2024 secretariat activities, programme delivery highlights and financial performance;¹⁰ budgetary implications of UNFCCC mandates, with an update on standard costs;¹¹ an update on the extent to which the UNFCCC core budget and budgets in the UNFCCC trust fund for supplementary activities were funded as at 31 March 2025;¹² and activities mandated by the governing and subsidiary bodies at the United Nations Climate Change Conference in Baku and their respective cost implications;¹³
27. *Decides* that the scale of contributions contained in the annex shall also be applicable for 2025, covering 92 per cent of the contributions specified in table 1 of decision 19/CP.28;

29. *Welcomes* the timely distribution of the programme budget for the biennium 2026–2027;¹⁴

30. *Notes with concern* that part of the documents on administrative, financial and institutional matters prepared for the sixty-second session of the Subsidiary Body for Implementation were not made available in a timely manner and *reiterates its request* for the secretariat to issue documents in a timely manner, at least four weeks before the opening of each session.
