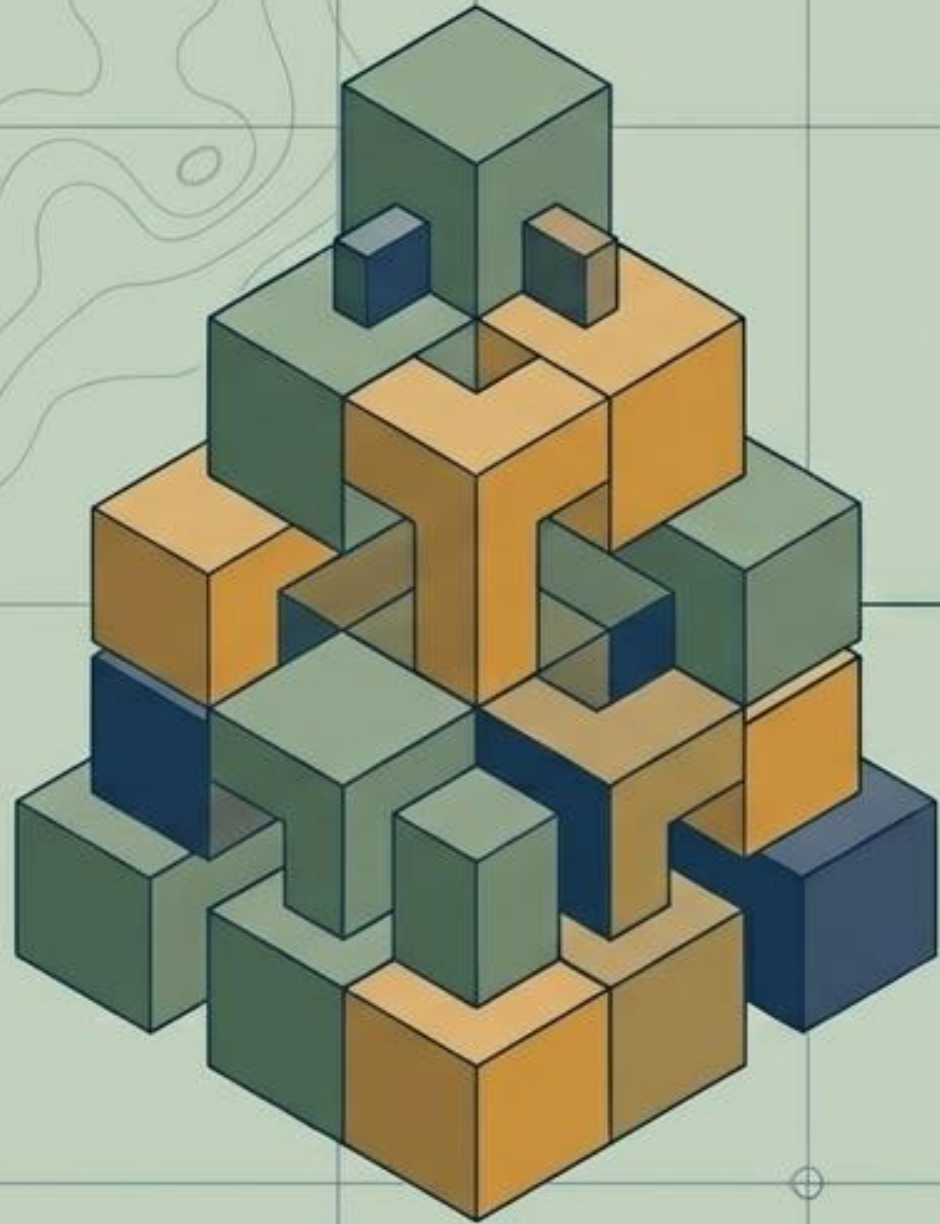

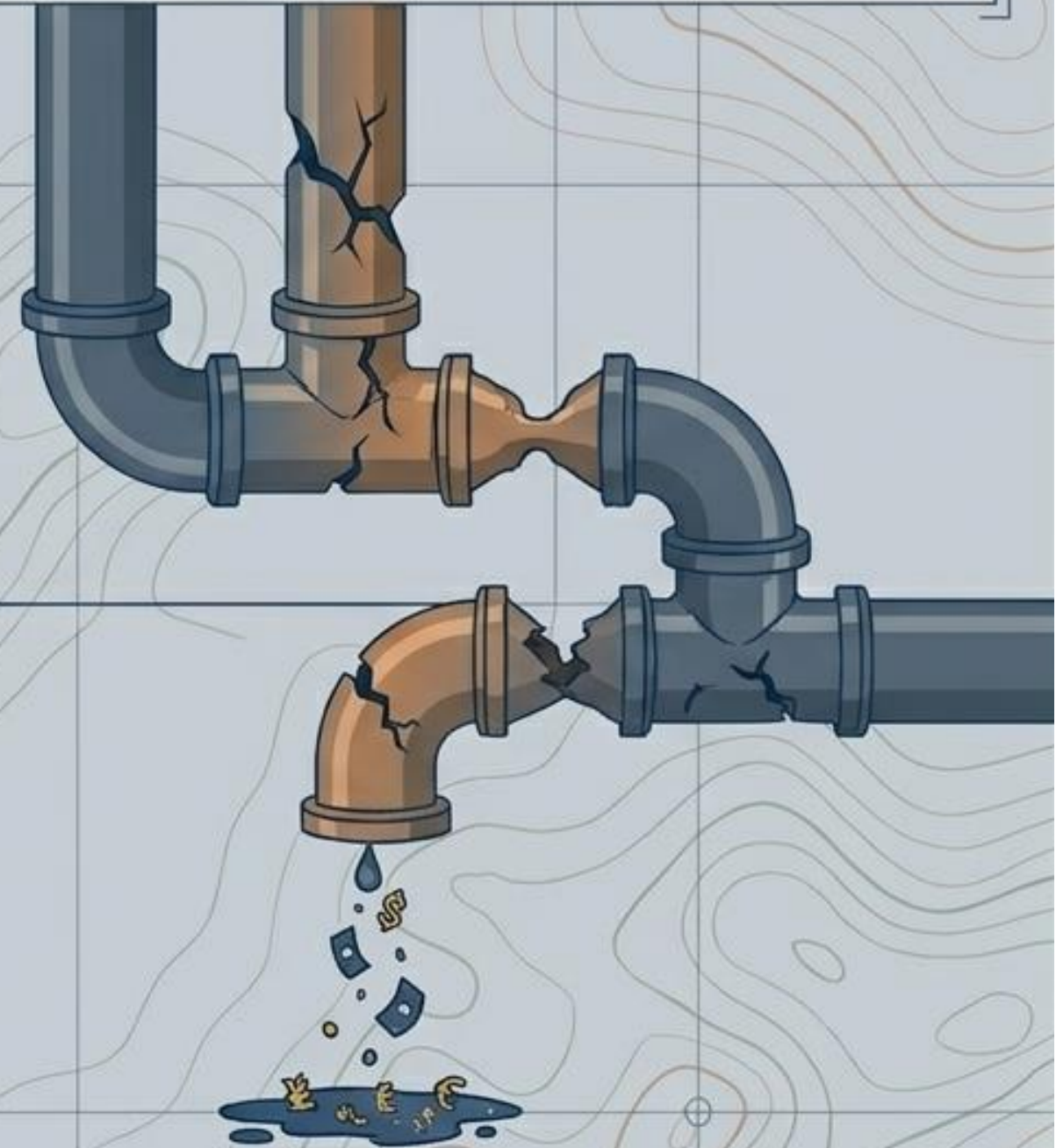

CHALLENGE: The Friction of Implementation



Agriculture continues to receive a limited and insignificant share of global climate finance. Substantial barriers prevent access to existing implementation channels.

The Delivery Deficit: Diagnosing the Finance Gap



Inadequate Scale

Funding volumes remain fundamentally disproportionate to the massive adaptation needs of small-scale farmers and local communities.



Insufficient Speed

Deployment timelines are too slow to match the accelerating pace of climate shocks threatening food security.



Restrictive Terms

The financial structures, technology transfer mechanisms, and capacity-building conditions are not optimized for vulnerable end-users.

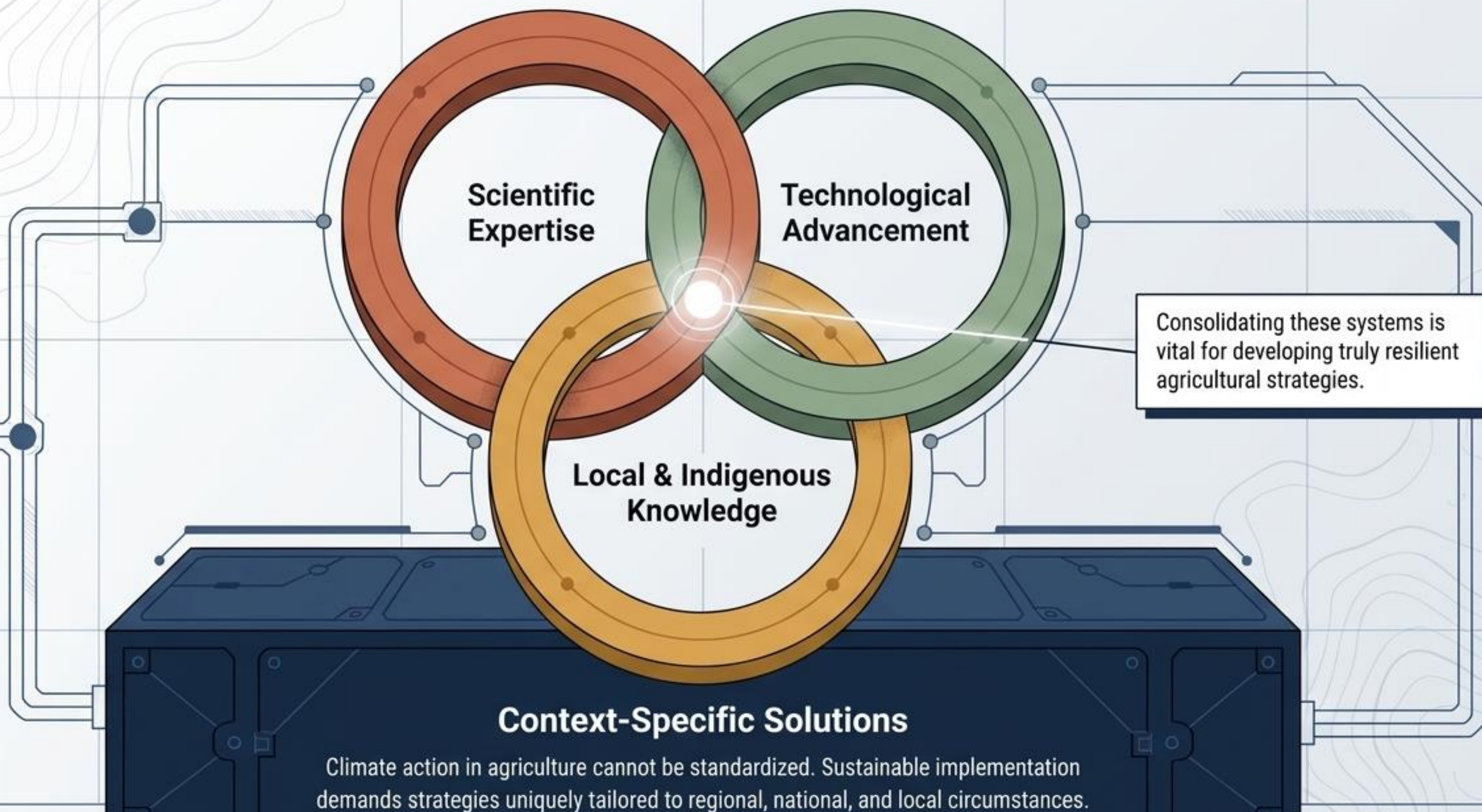

The Catalyst for Change

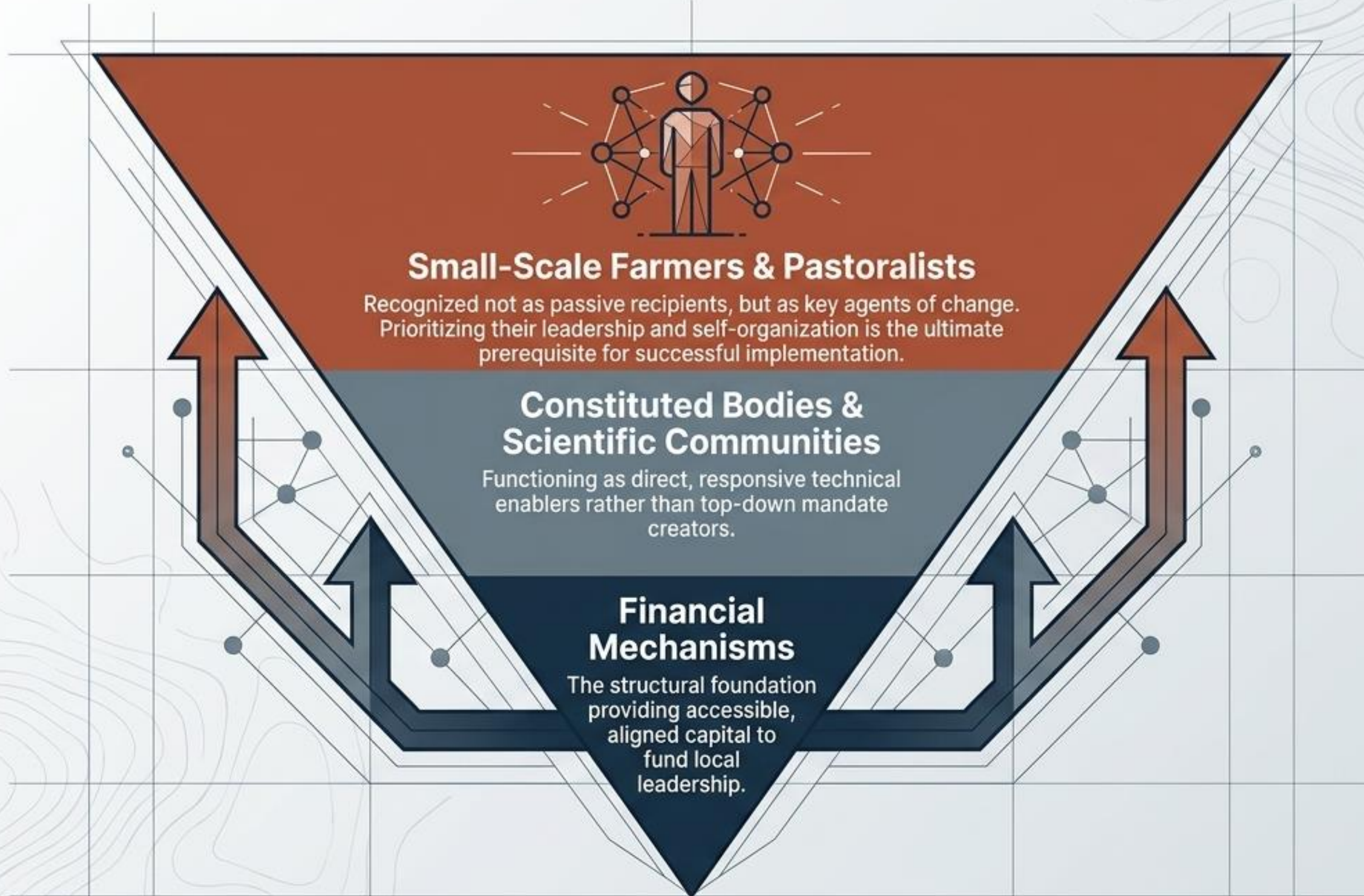
The KJWA and SJWA provide the impetus to completely change the narrative.

Success requires moving from identifying needs to deploying targeted, coherent interventions.

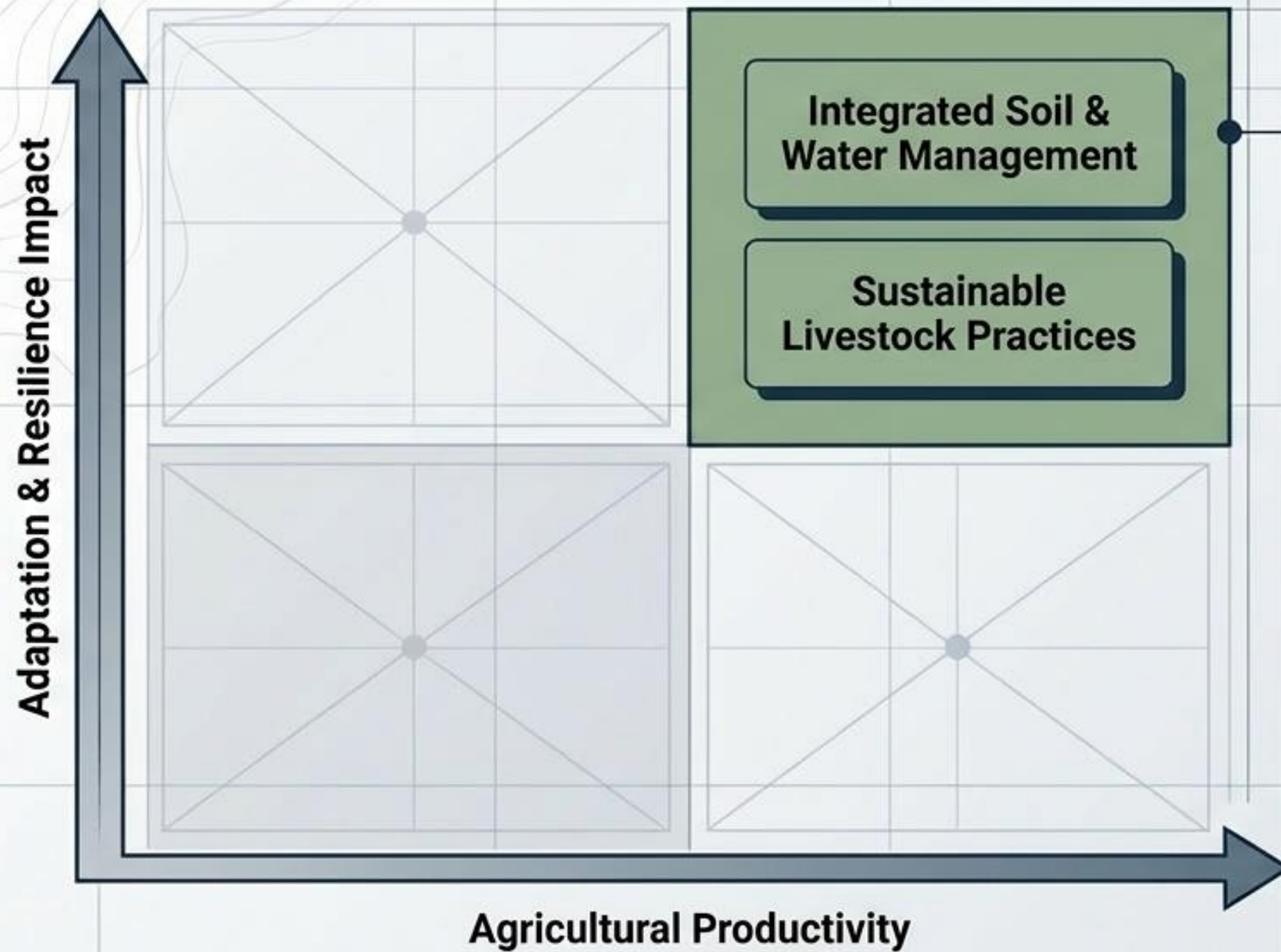

Redesigning the Hierarchy: Stakeholder-Led Approaches



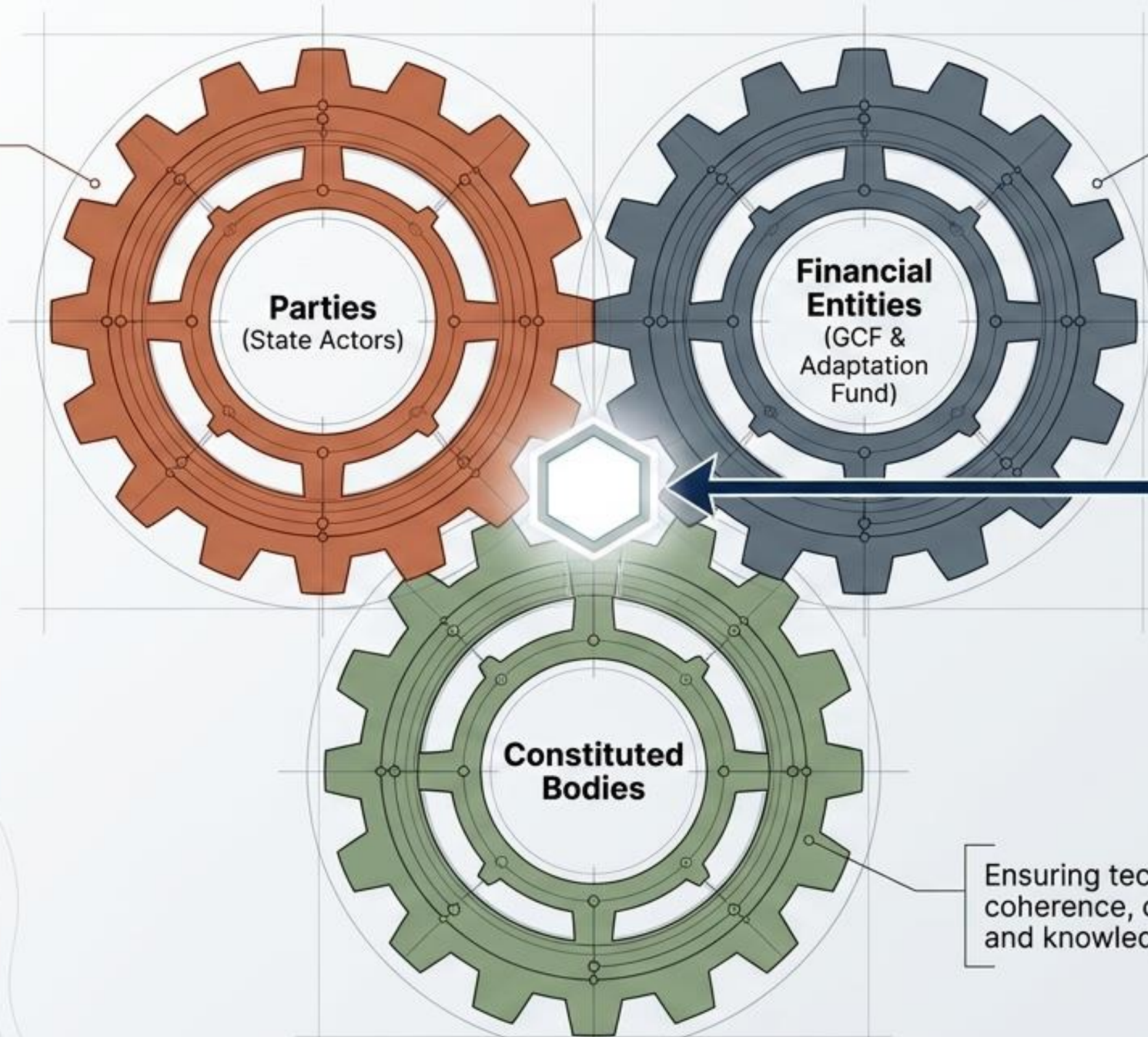
The No-Regrets Matrix: Holistic Management
