

**Guidelines in providing the inputs:**

- “Sub-elements”: Describe the specific area of the proposed input (e.g. Policies relating to access, gender, environment & social safeguards, etc.);
- “Proposed inputs”: Propose the inputs in draft decision text format;
- “To be considered by”: Choose whether the proposed inputs need to be considered: (1) Commonly by the COP and the CMA or; (2) specifically by the CMA;
- “Rationale for the inputs”: Annotate the reason for proposing the inputs, so that the rationale can be clearly understood;
- “Source of information / reference”: Provide reference to the annual reports of the operating entities or decision(s) of the GEF Council / GCF Board.

Chile still has a lack of guidelines and personalized advice from the GCF considering our own reality.	
		Recommend the opening of regional offices of the GCF, including with technical native speaking staff to address countries’ needs, facilitate and expedite information and procedures (legal, administrative or technical nature) to access funding and start the implementation of projects.			
		Encourage the GCF to enhance and update the process to develop country programmes, identifying the gaps and improving the communication between the GCF and NDA, considering the different national circumstances.
