About APCW

The APCW is set to boost the region's response to climate change. It is a unique collaborative platform for government and non-Party stakeholders to address the width of climate issues under one umbrella and unity of purpose. This year, the Climate Week is organized in support of a strong outcome at the UN Climate Action Summit hosted by the Secretary-General on 23 September 2019.

The APCW provides a space to develop multi-stakeholder climate action in the spirit of the Talanoa Dialogue, in reference to the traditional Pacific islands' notion of an inclusive, participatory and transparent dialogue. APCW 2019 will gather ministers, policymakers and other local, national, regional leaders, representatives of the private sector, investors and civil society to engage in in-depth discussions on five of the nine Summit tracks: **energy transition; industry transition; infrastructure; cities and local action; resilience and adaptation; and nature-based solutions**. It will also consolidate the region's contribution to Summit to the extent possible.

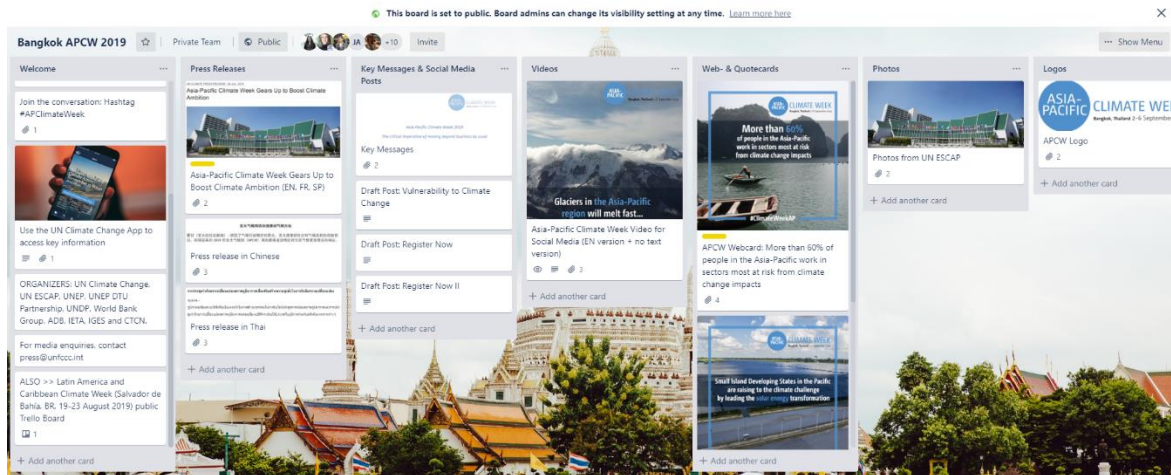
