# **Guiding Questions**

# **Initial Report: Participation responsibilities**

# The initial report should demonstrate that the participating Party fulfils the participation responsibilities referred to in chapter II of the annex of decision 2/CMA.3

- 3. Each Party participating in a cooperative approach that involves the use of ITMOs (hereinafter referred as a participating Party) shall ensure that its participation in the cooperative approach and the authorization, transfer and use of ITMOs is consistent with this guidance and relevant decisions of the CMA and that it applies this guidance to all corresponding adjustments and cooperative approaches in which it participates.
- 4. Each participating Party shall ensure that:
  - (a) It is a **Party to the Paris Agreement**;
  - (b) It has **prepared, communicated and is maintaining an NDC** in accordance with Article 4, paragraph 2;
  - (c) It has **arrangements** in place for **authorizing the use of ITMOs towards achievement of NDCs** pursuant to Article 6, paragraph 3;
  - (d) It has **arrangements** in place that are consistent with this guidance and relevant decisions of the CMA for **tracking ITMOs**;
  - (e) It has **provided the most recent national inventory report** required in accordance with decision 18/CMA.1;
  - (f) Its participation contributes to the implementation of its NDC and long-term low-emission development strategy, if it has submitted one, and the long-term goals of the Paris Agreement.

What are the potential challenges Parties may face in addressing reporting elements in relation to participation (para. 18(a))?

- Determining the level of detail that should be reported
- Establishing suitable institutional arrangements
  - Designating responsibility for reporting;
  - Sourcing data and information required; and
  - Coordinating with partner countries.

What institutional set-up would support the successful submission of the initial report?

- Best-practice institutional arrangements will be country-specific, and should be robust, streamlined (where possible) and facilitate transparency.
- Parties will need to consider the regulatory, technical and policy framework needed to:
  - Coordinate across different agencies, levels of government and with partner countries to ensure reporting alignment;
  - Ensure Parties can source required information, including from nongovernment entities; and
  - Facilitate the technical process of reporting i.e. digital infrastructure.

# Illustrative elements of information with example text

- Secretariat to develop a manual containing illustrative elements of information to assist Parties in understanding how they report.
- Suggested illustrative elements are a useful starting point for our discussions but further work is needed to clarify and elaborate some of the options. For example: Section 1.B. below.<sup>1</sup>
- I. Participation responsibilities
- B. Information in relation to the Party's fulfilment of its responsibility to ensure that it has prepared, communicated and is maintaining an NDC in accordance with Article 4, paragraph 2 (para. 18(a), para. 4(b), to be updated by para. 21(a))

What information can support an understanding of how participation contributes to the implementation of the Party's NDC and its long-term low-emission development strategy, if it has submitted one, and the long-term goals of the Paris Agreement?

- Parties need to consider how cooperative approaches contribute to NDC implementation; LT-LEDS and the Paris goals <u>prior</u> to engaging in Article 6.
- Information is needed to help Parties develop a strategy for Article 6
  engagement that considers what participation means in practice. Resources
  could support Parties to:
  - Understand their emissions profile and national circumstances to identify how mitigation outcomes can enhance ambition, and contribute to, and complement other policies; and
  - Undertake periodic reviews to evaluate the progressive impact of mitigation outcomes on NDC implementation, LT-LEDS and long-term Paris goals.
