Annex B: Estimated budget for Santiago network 2024

Included below is an indicative budget for the first year of the Santiago network. The final operating budget will depend on donor contributions to the network as well as the volume and nature of demand for assistance from developing countries. The budget consists of fixed costs to guarantee the operation of the network/secretariat, as well as variable costs that depend on the volume of activities.
