SBSTA Chair informal document, including textual proposals, for consideration by the SBSTA in recommending a draft decision on the work programme under the framework for non-market approaches referred to in Article 6, paragraph 8, of the Paris Agreement and in decision 4/CMA.3 for consideration and adoption at CMA.4

Introduction

A. Mandate

1. Article 6, paragraph 8, of the Paris Agreement recognizes the importance of integrated, holistic and balanced non-market approaches (NMAs) being available to Parties to assist in the implementation of their nationally determined contributions (NDCs). To facilitate the deliberations of the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches (GCNMA) at GCNMA 2, the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA) requested¹ its Chair to prepare an informal document on the basis of the outcomes of the intersessional work outlined in paragraphs 133–135 of the report on SBSTA 56,² including textual proposals, for consideration by the SBSTA in recommending a draft decision on the schedule for implementing the work programme activities and the specifications for the UNFCCC web-based platform referred to in paragraph 8(b)(i) of the annex to decision 4/CMA.3 for consideration and adoption by the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement (CMA) at its fourth session.

2. The GCNMA is also requested³ to report on progress and outcomes of the work programme, as appropriate, at each session of the CMA on the basis of information resulting from implementation of the work programme activities. The report should include, as relevant:

(a) Results of the implementation of the work programme activities;

(b) Recommendations on how to enhance existing linkages and create synergies and how to facilitate coordination and implementation of NMAs;

(c) Recommendations on how to facilitate support for NMAs, including through engagement with relevant bodies, institutional arrangements and processes under the Convention and the Paris Agreement related to, inter alia, mitigation, adaptation, finance, technology development and transfer, and capacity-building;

(d) Recommendations on work programme activities in implementing the framework.

B. Scope

3. The annexes to this informal document contain the textual proposals for the draft conclusions and draft decision on the work programme, prepared by the SBSTA Chair on the basis of the above mandates. As the textual proposals for the draft decision represent the recommendations of the GCNMA to the CMA as a component of the report on progress and outcomes referred to in paragraph 2 above, a draft of this report is included in the draft conclusions to the SBSTA in annex I.

C. Approach

4. The SBSTA Chair has developed textual proposals for the draft decision on the basis of the outcomes of the intersessional work outlined in paragraphs 133–135 of the report on SBSTA 56.

5. The textual proposals for the draft decision seek to:

(a) Streamline the structure, including removing duplication, without removing elements, in particular the structure of the schedule set out in the table in annex II;

(b) Clarify options and potential additional elements to be considered and decided by Parties.

6. In the textual proposals for the draft decision, all paragraphs and subparagraphs have been numbered sequentially, including in the list of outcomes in the schedule set out in the table in annex II, to make it easier for Parties to identify the substantive content of the options when using the informal document to facilitate discussions at SBSTA 57.

7. Generally, throughout the textual proposals of the draft decision, curly brackets containing italicized text are used to provide information about relevant options.

8. Where the textual proposals for the draft decision contain options, these are labelled as, for example, **option A**, **option B**. To assist in the navigation of the text, options are followed by a brief indicative narrative, in curly brackets and in bold italicized text.

9. Where an option has several potential sub-elements, the note is included just before the list begins, in order to show Parties that they need to consider each sub-element independently, and not as a group.

10. Where certain options may have implications for listed outcomes in the schedule set out in the table in annex II, these implications are noted. Upon resolution of the primary options in sections I–VI of annex II, the appropriate consequential changes will be made to the entries in the schedule set out in the table.

D. Possible action by the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice

11. The SBSTA may wish to consider this informal document and the textual proposals contained in the annexes in developing recommendations for consideration and adoption at CMA 4.

Annex I

Draft conclusions proposed by the Chair

1. The SBSTA, pursuant to paragraph 9 of the annex to decision 4/CMA.3, agreed to forward to the CMA as a report of the GCNMA, as appropriate, information on the progress and outcomes of the work programme, as relevant, contained in paragraphs 2–6 below.

2. The SBSTA welcomed the report on the in-session workshop on the matters referred to in paragraph 6 of decision 4/CMA.3, held in conjunction with SBSTA 56.

3. The SBSTA convened GCNMA 2 in accordance with paragraph 5 of the annex to decision 4/CMA.3 and, on the basis of the outcomes of the work programme at the GCNMA $1,^4$ continued its consideration of:

(a) Developing and recommending a schedule for implementing the work programme activities referred to in chapter V of the annex (Work programme activities) to decision 4/CMA.3, which may contain the timeline and expected outcomes for each activity, including specifications for the UNFCCC web-based platform referred to in paragraph 8(b)(i) of the annex to decision 4/CMA.3, such as its functions, form, target users and information to be contained thereon;⁵

(b) Identifying focus areas of the work programme activities;⁶

(c) Identifying existing NMAs under the framework that are in accordance with the provisions referred to in chapter II of the annex (Non-market approaches under the framework) to decision 4/CMA.3;⁷

(d) Identifying and evaluating positive and other experience of existing linkages, synergies, coordination and implementation in relation to NMAs;⁸

(e) Developing and implementing tools, with the assistance of the secretariat, including a UNFCCC web-based platform for recording and exchanging information on NMAs, including information identified through the work programme, and supporting the identification of opportunities for participating Parties to identify, develop and implement NMAs.⁹

4. The SBSTA welcomed the broad participation of relevant experts in the virtual intersessional workshop on the specifications for the UNFCCC web-based platform.¹⁰ It also welcomed views and information submitted by Parties and observers, including on this matter,¹¹ and a technical paper¹² prepared by the secretariat on the matter, which served as inputs to the implementation of the work programme activity referred to in paragraph 3(e) above, including the workshop.

5. The SBSTA further welcomed a synthesis report¹³ prepared by the secretariat on the views and information submitted by Parties and observers, referred to in paragraph 4 above, and a technical paper¹⁴ prepared by the secretariat on the existing linkages, synergies and facilitated coordination and implementation of NMAs in the local, subnational, national and global context; how Parties have addressed the matter referred to in paragraph 3(e) of the

annex to decision 4/CMA.3; and how Parties have identified, developed and implemented NMAs at the country, regional and global level, which served as inputs to the implementation of work programme activities referred to in paragraphs 3(a), (c), (d) and (e) above.

6. Pursuant to the request of the CMA,¹⁵ the SBSTA agreed to forward to the CMA a draft decision, contained in annex II, on the schedule for implementing the activities of the work programme under the framework for NMAs referred to in Article 6, paragraph 8, of the Paris Agreement and in decision 4/CMA.3[.][,][recognizing that this text does not represent a consensus among Parties and that further work by the CMA is necessary to finalize the decision.]

Annex II

Decision -/CMA.4

Matters relating to the schedule for implementing the activities of the work programme under the framework for non-market approaches referred to in Article 6, paragraph 8, of the Paris Agreement and in decision 4/CMA.3

The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement,

Recalling decision 4/CMA.3 and the Paris Agreement,

Noting with appreciation the contributions received from Parties and observers in support of implementing the framework for non-market approaches referred to in Article 6, paragraph 8, of the Paris Agreement,

1. *Welcomes* the report {*contained in annex I above*} of the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches that includes progress in and recommendations for implementing the work programme under the framework for non-market approaches referred to in Article 6, paragraph 8, of the Paris Agreement and in decision 4/CMA.3;

I. Schedule for implementing the work programme activities

2. *Adopts* the schedule for implementing the activities of the work programme under the framework for non-market approaches referred to in Article 6, paragraph 8, of the Paris Agreement and in decision 4/CMA.3, as contained in the table in the appendix;

3. *Requests* the Glasgow Committee for Non-market Approaches to implement the schedule for implementing the work programme activities referred to in chapter V of the annex to decision 4/CMA.3 for 2022–[2025][2026] that consists of two phases:

Option A {2022–2023 focus on para. 8(a) and (b)(i) and 2024–2025 focus on para. 8(b)(*ii–iii*)}

(a) An identification phase (2022–2023) that focuses on work programme activities referred to in paragraph 8(a) and (b)(i) of the annex to decision 4/CMA.3, with a view to providing Parties an opportunity to establish a better understanding of existing and possible non-market approaches;

(b) An implementation phase (2024–2025) that focuses on work programme activities referred to in paragraph 8(b)(ii–iii) of the annex to decision 4/CMA.3;

Option B {2022–2023 and 2024–2025 focus on all subparas. of para. 8}

(a) An identification phase (2022–2023) that focuses on identifying and framing all relevant elements of the work programme activities referred to in paragraph 8 of the annex to decision 4/CMA.3;

(b) An implementation phase (2024–2025) that focuses on fully implementing the work programme activities referred to in paragraph 3(a) above following a learning-by-doing approach, drawing on inputs from the identification phase;

Option C {*No phased approach*}

{*End of option C*}

Option A {*Assessment of outcomes of each phase*}

4. *Requests* the Glasgow Committee for Non-market Approaches to assess the outcomes of each phase at its 4th (November 2023) and 8th (November 2025) meetings and adjust the schedule for implementing the work programme activities, as appropriate, taking into account any additional mandates on this matter received from the CMA;

Option B {*No assessment*}

{*End of option B*}

II. UNFCCC web-based platform for non-market approaches

5. *Requests* the secretariat to develop and operationalize the UNFCCC web-based platform referred to in paragraph 8(b)(i) of the annex to decision 4/CMA.3 for recording and exchanging information on NMAs in a user-friendly and accessible manner for Parties participating in NMAs and other non-Party stakeholders, in accordance with standard UNFCCC practices for web-based communications and the specifications referred to in paragraphs 6–16 below;

Option A {*Recording existing NMAs*}

6. *Decides* that a Party participating in an NMA may, with the concurrence of the other participating Parties, voluntarily submit the following to the secretariat for recording information on the NMA in the UNFCCC web-based platform:

(a) A description of the NMA and the national implementing entities, including their contact information;

(b) Information on the how NMA addresses the requirements and criteria referred to in paragraphs 2–3 of the annex to decision 4/CMA.3;

(c) Updates to the information already provided on the NMA, as applicable, including any available reporting on progress in implementing the NMA or any lessons learned or case studies relating to the NMA;

Option B {Recording existing NMAs, intended NMAs and support available} {This option includes paragraph 6 above}

7. *Also decides* that Parties that intend to identify, develop and implement an NMA to be facilitated under the framework may, with the agreement of the other participating Parties, voluntarily submit the following to the secretariat for recording in the UNFCCC web-based information on the intended NMA:

(a) A description of the intended NMA and the national implementing entities, including their contact information;

(b) Information on how the NMA will address the requirements and criteria referred to in paragraphs 2–3 of the annex to decision 4/CMA.3;

(c) A description of the financial, technology and capacity-building support needed to identify, develop and implement an NMA;

8. *Further decides* that Parties; the entities entrusted with operating the financial mechanism, including the Global Environment Facility and the Green Climate Fund; multilateral, bilateral and other public donors; and private and non-governmental organizations that are in a position to do so, may submit to the secretariat, as appropriate, information on financial, technology and capacity-building support available or provided for identifying, developing or implementing NMAs, for recording on the UNFCCC web-based platform;

9. *Notes* that recording a proposed NMA or support available on the UNFCCC webbased platform does not create any rights or obligations for any Party or other entity; **Option C** {*Recording existing NMAs, intended NMAs and support available, and matching intended NMAs with support available*} {*This option includes paragraphs* 6–9 *above*}

10. *Decides* that the UNFCCC web-based platform will facilitate matching intended NMAs that need financial, technology and capacity-building support with support available by providing and directing information to Parties that have submitted intended NMAs and are seeking support, and Parties and entities that have submitted information on the support available;

11. *Requests* the secretariat, subject to the availability of resources, to facilitate matching intended NMAs with support available by:

Option C1 {*Manual matching*}

(a) Providing, at the request of Parties, information on the available sources of support relevant to their intended NMAs;

(b) Organizing workshops to understand the diversity of intended NMAs and the support available;

Option C2 {*Automated matching through algorithm*}

(a) Performing matching tasks using algorithms and artificial intelligence systems
 (e.g. deep search, machine learning) and sending automatic notifications to the relevant nominated contact person with a list of potential matches;

Option C3 {Combination of manual and automated matching} {This option includes options C1 and C2 above}

{*End of option C*}

Option A {Linking the web-based platform to the CARP}

12. *Also decides* that the UNFCCC web-based platform will be linked to the centralized accounting and reporting platform established in paragraph 35 of the annex to decision 2/CMA.3;

Option B {*No linking the web-based platform to the CARP*}

{*End of option B*}

13. *Further decides* that the UNFCCC web-based platform is to contain an information hub that provides information on available resources and tools, includes links to relevant sites and news, a visualization tool for mapping NMAs [and existing initiatives, programmes and projects, including those that support Parties in meeting the requirements for receiving support and provide capacity-building for implementing NMAs] and assembling country and multi-country profiles, and a discussion forum that Parties and non-Party stakeholders could access to facilitate networking;

14. *Requests* the secretariat to provide to the Glasgow Committee for Non-market Approaches regular updates on the status of the development and operationalization of the UNFCCC web-based platform;

15. *Also requests* the Glasgow Committee for Non-market Approaches to provide the secretariat with additional guidance on the development and operationalization of the UNFCCC web-based platform as required;

16. *Encourages* Parties to submit non-market approaches in the focus areas to the UNFCCC web-based platform once it becomes operational;

III. Additional focus areas of the work programme activities

Option A {*Additional focus areas to be decided at GCNMA 2*}

17. *Decides* that focus areas of the work programme activities that are additional to the three focus areas referred to in paragraph 3 of decision 4/CMA.3 include the following: *[potential list below]*

- (a) Adaptation benefits mechanism;
- (b) Blue carbon;
- (c) Blue economy;
- (d) Circular economy;
- (e) Climate-smart agriculture;

(f) Cooperation between Parties and Non-Party actors, including innovative forms of international cooperation;

- (g) Energy transition;
- (h) Engagement of youth, gender and indigenous peoples;
- (i) Financial policies and measures;
- (j) Innovative climate, financial and economic mechanisms;
- (k) Joint mitigation and adaptation measures;
- (l) Just transition of the workforce;
- (m) Lifestyle for Environment;

(n) Mitigation measure to address climate change and contribute to sustainable development in the form of emissions avoidance measures or actions;

- (o) Nature-based solutions;
- (p) Payments for ecosystem services;
- (q) REDD+; ("Activities referred to in decision 1/CP.16, paragraph 70")
- (r) Resource efficiency;

(s) Results-based finance for mitigation and adaptation under the REDD+ framework; ("framework of activities referred to in decision 1/CP.16, paragraph 70")

- (t) Results-based payment outside of the land-based sector;
- (u) Social inclusion;

Option B {*Additional focus area to be decided in 2024*}

18. *Requests* Parties and observers to make submissions on potential additional focus areas via the submission portal,¹⁶ by 28 February 2024;

19. *Also requests* the Glasgow Committee for Non-market Approaches to review and amend the focus areas of the work programme activities, as appropriate, at its 5th meeting (June 2024) on the basis of the submissions of Parties and observers referred to in paragraph 18 above;

Option C {*No additional focus areas*}

IV. Coordination network and working groups

Option A {*Coordination network and working groups established*}

20. *Requests* the SBSTA Chair as the convener of the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches to invite representatives of the Adaptation Fund, the Climate Technology Centre and Network, the Global Environment Facility, the Green Climate Fund, the local communities and indigenous peoples platform, the Paris Committee on Capacity-building, the Standing Committee on Finance and the Technology Executive Committee, to meet as a network for coordinating UNFCCC entities on NMAs;

21. *Also requests* the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches to establish working groups of learning and best practices for sectoral, regional and global programmes and for financial and technical cooperation;

22. *Decides* that the working groups of learning and best practices shall share information, best practices, lessons learned and case studies relating to the development and implementation of NMAs, and may also reflect on:

(a) Promoting the replicability of successful NMAs at the local, subnational, national or global level;

(b) Promoting regulatory frameworks and policies conducive to the development of NMAs;

(c) Enhancing engagement in NMAs by civil society, indigenous peoples and vulnerable communities;

(d) Promoting successful experience that generates mitigation co-benefits resulting from adaptation action and/or economic diversification plans that assist the implementation of NDCs;

(e) Promoting cooperation on NMAs between Parties that supports the implementation of ambitious NDCs that contribute to achieving the long-term temperature goals of the Paris Agreement, including in relation to the development of NMAs;

(f) Sharing information to facilitate the reporting of NMA impacts on mitigation and adaptation;

(g) Establishing guidelines, procedures and safeguards to facilitate NMAs;

Option B {*No coordination network and working groups established*}

V. Inputs to the review of the work programme activities in 2026

Option A {*Terms of reference for review of the work programme activities in 2026*}

23. *Invites* Parties and observers to submit via the submission portal, by 28 February 2025, views and information on the terms of reference for the review of the work programme, including its activities;

24. *Requests* the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches to develop and recommend the terms of reference for the review of the work programme, including its activities, referred to in paragraph 10 of decision 4/CMA.4 for consideration and adoption by the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement at its seventh session (November 2025);

25. *Invites* Parties and observers to submit via the submission portal, by 28 February 2026, views and information on the review of the work programme referred to in paragraph 10 of decision 4/CMA.3, including on work programme activities and focus areas, taking into

account the terms of reference for the review of the work programme referred to in paragraph 24 above;

26. *Requests* the secretariat to prepare a synthesis report on the matters referred to in paragraph 25 above for consideration by the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches at its 7th meeting (June 2025);

Option B {*No terms of reference for review of the work programme activities in 2026*}

{*End of option B*}

VI. Cross-cutting matters

27. *Encourages* Parties, public and private sector stakeholders and civil society organizations to actively engage in the research, development and implementation of non-market approaches under the framework;

28. *Requests* the secretariat to design and, following consultation with Parties, implement a capacity-building programme, including through its regional collaboration centres, to assist Parties, particularly developing country Parties, to identify, develop and implement NMAs to be facilitated under the framework;

29. *Takes note* of the estimated budgetary implications of the activities to be undertaken by the secretariat referred to in this decision and *requests* that the actions called for in this decision be undertaken subject to the availability of financial resources;

30. *Invites* Parties to make contributions to the Trust Fund for Supplementary Activities for operationalizing the work programme.]
