## (a) Short- and Medium-to-Long-Term Priorities

Short term

Direct financing for grassroots, youth-led climate initiatives, including afforestation, reforestation, and ecosystem restoration.

Capacity building for climate project development and funding access at the community level. Long term:

Structural investments in green jobs, climate-smart agriculture, and clean energy for youth and women in rural areas.

Stronger national climate finance frameworks that embed youth perspectives and local solutions.

## (b) Scaling Adaptation Finance in Vulnerable Regions

#### We recommend:

Establishing youth-targeted climate adaptation innovation grants.

Expanding community-based adaptation funding within existing multilateral climate funds.

Supporting climate education hubs to localize solutions and enhance adaptive capacity in vulnerable regions.

## (c) Innovative Financing and Expanding Fiscal Space

To achieve the \$1.3 trillion target, we propose:

Deploying green bonds and climate risk insurance to support community-led adaptation projects.

Supporting non-debt climate funds that promote conservation-based entrepreneurship and circular economy models.

Mobilizing resources through climate-tourism initiatives, exemplified by our Go Green Campaign, which combines tree planting, mountain cleanups, and sustainable tourism.

# (d) Key Actors and Partnerships

We urge:

Greater involvement of youth-led organizations, Indigenous communities, and local authorities in decision-making and resource allocation.

Leveraging platforms such as the UN Joint SDG Fund, Global Youth Climate Networks, and faith-based development organizations.

Strengthening partnerships with regional climate finance bodies like the African Green Facility and the Adaptation Benefit Mechanism.

Through the Go Green, Serve Nature Campaign, CYCA has mobilized thousands of youth across Tanzania and the broader region to restore degraded landscapes, advocate for green finance, and promote climate-resilient tourism. We are committed to advancing the Roadmap to 1.3T and ensuring no one especially no youth is left behind.
