# Private Sector in Action: Implementation

## **Rice & Methane Reduction — Southeast Asia**

**Partnership** - CropLife International, PepsiCo and Olam Agri partnering with GIZ

Promoting **alternate wetting and drying** — reducing both water use and methane emissions

## **Danish Green Tripartite Agreement**

Government, industry and environmental organisations aligned around a **shared framework**

Reducing emissions while maintaining a **competitive food and agriculture sector**

Model example of combining policy, incentives, financing and practical implementation

## **Dairy Sustainability Framework**

The dairy sectors monitoring and reporting framework covering **30% of global milk production** (over 50% of global formal milk production) Tracks progress across **11 sustainability criteria** using high-level indicator metrics. The DSF is also a program that uses sustainability as a value chain capacity building mechanism.

- **Value creation drives adoption** — Climate solutions scale only when they improve productivity, resilience and livelihoods for farmers and agrifood businesses.
- **Integration is essential** — Finance, technology, capacity-building and advisory services work best when delivered together, not as separate interventions.
- **Accessibility to funding** — Current financing mechanisms are too complex and slow; bridging the gap between urgency on the ground and pace of delivery is critical
- **Enabling environments unlock investment** — Stable policies, clear market signals and long-term certainty are prerequisites for transformation at scale
