Background paper on the second review of the functions of the Standing Committee on Finance

Expected actions by the Standing Committee on Finance

The Standing Committee on Finance will be invited to agree on:

- a) Appoint co-facilitators for the work;
- b) The scope of the self-assessment, including areas for possible recommendations to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the Committee;
- c) Provide guidance to the co-facilitators on the inter-sessional work to prepare the self-assessment report.

I. Possible actions for consideration by the Standing Committee on Finance

- 1. The Standing Committee on Finance (SCF) may wish to **appoint co-facilitators**, who will guide the preparation of the self-assessment report of the Committee, in line with the terms of reference (TOR) for the second review of the functions of the SCF (see annex I), adopted by the Conference the Parties (COP) at its 27th session and affirmed by the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement (CMA) at its 4th session.
- 2. The SCF may wish to agree on the **scope of its self-assessment** in the fulfilment of its mandates to assist the COP in the exercise of its functions with respect to the Financial Mechanism and to serve the Paris Agreement. The scope could cover:
- (a) On the progress made to date: the SCF may wish to consider the seven proposed areas to be assessed, as well as relevant technical work that could be conducted for each area (see Annex II);
- (b) On the lessons learned by the SCF: the SCF may wish to consider incorporating lessons learned by the SCF members, including previous members who served the SCF during the review period (2018–2023), into the self-assessment report. The lessons learned could be collected by launching a survey on perspectives, experiences and lessons learned on the seven areas of assessment, as identified in annex II.
- 3. The SCF also may wish to reflect how **effectiveness and efficiency** of the Committee can be defined, which are the two qualifiers for possible recommendations as identified in the TOR. In this context, the SCF may wish to consider and agree on possible areas for recommendations on improving its efficiency and effectiveness, as presented in annex III.

- 4. Furthermore, the SCF may wish to provide guidance to the co-facilitators on the **intersessional work** to be undertaken. Tentative timeline and activities are identified in annex IV, including:
- (a) Initiation of the technical work to compile factual information and analyze it in line with the scope of the review to be agreed during this meeting;
- (b) Preparation of a submission by the SCF to SBI 58,¹ on the overview of mandates provided to the SCF compared to outputs delivered by the Committee during the review period;²
- (c) Preparation and circulation of the survey to the incumbent and previous SCF members;
- (d) Issuing a call for inputs from Parties, observers, other constituted bodies, the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism and other external stakeholders, to ask for their experience and views relating to the proposed areas of self-assessment, as specified in annex II;
- (e) Preparation of a first order draft of self-assessment report to be considered by the SCF at its thirty-first meeting.

II. Background

- 5. At COP 27, Parties adopted the TOR for the second review of the functions of the SCF. The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement at its fourth session affirmed the decision which adopted the TOR for the second review. See annex I for the TOR.
- 6. The TOR includes the objective, scope, sources of information and criteria for the review. One of the sources on information for the review is a self-assessment report of the SCF and recommendations on improving its efficiency and effectiveness.
- 7. Below table outlines the process and tentative time of the second review, as set out by the COP decision.

Annex I

Terms of reference for the second review of the functions of the Standing Committee on Finance

I. **Objective**

- The objective of the second review is to review the functions of the Standing Committee on Finance (SCF) with a view to:
 - Strengthening the work of the SCF, as appropriate; (a)
 - Identifying opportunities for increased efficiency and effectiveness; (b)
- Informing Parties on the extent to which the existing activities and working (c) modalities of the SCF facilitate it to fulfil its mandate to serve the Paris Agreement in line with decision 1/CP.21, paragraph 63;
- Taking into account interrelated review processes, such as the review of the Financial Mechanism.

II. Scope

- The scope of the review will cover progress to date and lessons learned in the fulfilment of the mandate of the SCF to assist the Conference of the Parties (COP) and serve the Paris Agreement in the exercise of its functions with respect to the Financial Mechanism. In this context, the review should:
 - Be based on the current mandate and functions of the SCF;
 - (b) Be informed by the work on climate finance conducted by other entities;
- Examine whether any gaps exist in the delivery of the work of the SCF and how they can be addressed, taking into consideration the capacity of the SCF to deliver its work.
- 3. The review should address the following elements:
- Assessment of the extent to which the SCF has effectively delivered on its four core functions and mandated activities³ outlined in relevant decisions and, in this regard, take stock of past achievements of the SCF in terms of its concrete outputs and how they have been utilized;
- Identification of the potential need for reorientation or reprioritization of the existing functions of the SCF;
- Assessment of whether the working modalities of the SCF, including the participation of its members, are fit for purpose for carrying out its functions;
 - (d) Quality of outputs;
- (e) Linkages with the constituted bodies under the Convention and the Paris Agreement;

(f) Relations with relevant external stakeholders.

III. Sources of information

- 4. The review shall draw upon, inter alia, the following sources of information:
- (a) Submissions from members of the SCF, Parties to the Convention and the Paris Agreement, and the constituted bodies under the Convention and the Paris Agreement, as well as external stakeholders involved in the activities of the SCF;
 - (b) Annual reports of the SCF;
- (c) Relevant decisions of the COP and the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement (CMA) relating to the SCF;
 - (d) Outputs delivered by the SCF;
- (e) The self-assessment report of the SCF and recommendations on improving its efficiency and effectiveness;
- (f) The technical paper to be prepared by the secretariat referred to in paragraph 6 of this decision.

IV. Criteria

- 5. The review shall take into account, inter alia, the following:
 - (a) The effectiveness and efficiency of the SCF in the delivery of its functions;
 - (b) The transparency of its decision-making processes;
 - (c) The inclusiveness and geographical representation of the SCF;
 - (d) The level and nature of its stakeholder engagement;
- (e) The quality and added value of the outputs of the SCF, including how they were received by the COP, the CMA and external stakeholders, and in particular how its recommendations have informed and advanced the work of the COP and the CMA;
 - (f) The timeliness of the outputs of the SCF.
