# **Background**

- The MPGs mandate the secretariat to organize the technical expert reviews (TERs), and to provide review tools and materials to the technical expert review teams (TERTs), including a detailed technical expert review report (TERR) template
- The TERTs are required to follow the TERR outline adopted by CMA 3 (decision 5/CMA.3) under the ETF

  elaborated the guiding principles for the development of the TERR
  template recalling the review scope outlined in the MPGs, including the
  provision on paying particular attention to the respective national
  capabilities and circumstances of developing country Parties and the
  flexibility provisions related to the technical review
- The 2023 LRs meeting requested the secretariat to operationalize these
  guiding principles in the review tools taking into consideration the
  experience gained and relevant practices developed during the BR/NC and
  GHG inventory reviews of developed country Parties and, in particular, the
  technical analysis of BURs submitted by developing country Parties


