

# Call for Inputs for the Belém Mission to 1.5

## Excellencies, Distinguished Colleagues, Our Global Community,

At COP30 in Belém, Parties came together to decisively transition to a new era focused on implementation. Through the Global Mutirão Decision, we acknowledged the significant collective progress towards the Paris Agreement's temperature goal while noting that this was not sufficient to achieve the temperature goal. Hence, we recognized the need for urgent action and support for achieving deep, rapid and sustained reductions of greenhouse gas emissions in line with 1.5°C pathways, noting that finance, capacity-building and technology transfer are critical enablers of climate action. Parties resolved to go further and faster, including to pursue efforts to limit the temperature increase to 1.5°C, to limit both the magnitude and duration of any temperature overshoot, and to close adaptation gaps.

It is in this context that the Belém Mission to 1.5 was conceived, aimed at enabling ambition and implementation of nationally determined contributions (NDCs) and national adaptation plans (NAPs), to reflect on accelerating implementation, international cooperation and investment. Parties entrusted the COP31, COP30 and COP29 Presidencies to steward the Belém Mission to 1.5 process, and we -Türkiye, Australia, Brazil and Azerbaijan - have been collaborating closely to deliver on the mandate. We are honored by this responsibility and write to provide further information.

We commence our work under the Belém Mission to 1.5 at a time of both challenge and opportunity. The impacts of climate change are being felt with increasing severity across the world, and detriment to the economic, social and physical wellbeing of all people. At the same time, the momentum for the global transition to a low emissions and climate resilient world continues to accelerate apace, driven by the compelling benefits of clean energy and climate action for energy security and access, economic development, health and wellbeing. A fact made more stark by recent global energy shocks. As highlighted in the Global Mutirão Decision, climate action presents significant economic and social benefits and opportunities, including economic growth, job creation, improved energy access and security, and improved public health.

## Plan of work for 2026

In this context, the Belém Mission to 1.5 will involve a series of activities and engagements throughout 2026 focused on identifying key opportunities to enable and accelerate the ambition and implementation of NDCs and NAPs, as well as reflecting on ways to enhance international cooperation and investments in those climate plans.

We invite all Parties and other actors to contribute their knowledge, perspectives and expertise in support of this initiative. The Mission will be shaped through submissions, consultations and exchanges with Parties, industry, financial actors, civil society, academia and all interested stakeholders. Throughout 2026, we will actively engage with all stakeholders and ensure inclusive and transparent consultations through holding convenings to collectively shape the Belém Mission to 1.5, including at major international meetings.

The Belém Mission to 1.5 will culminate in a report released ahead of COP31, outlining key opportunities, barriers, and actionable solutions to keeping 1.5°C within reach and strengthening adaptation and resilience in a changing world. The report will focus on high impact action areas and solutions, as supported by best-available science and evidence. The primary audience is decision-makers across the climate change ecosystem, including policymakers, business and technology innovators and investors.

### Call for submissions

To inform discussions and to help jointly shape the Belém Mission to 1.5, an initial call for submissions is welcomed from all actors and can be lodged by email to [presidencies@unfccc.int](mailto:presidencies@unfccc.int).

**Submissions are welcome by 30 June 2026.** Inputs received will be used to identify high impact barriers and opportunities that will be the focus for subsequent engagements throughout the year.

Submissions may choose to focus on global, country, regional or local scales and address any of the following:

1. What action areas and solutions have the highest impact potential to support the submission, ambition and implementation of NDCs and NAPs. This could include consideration of:
  - a. priority solutions and innovations across policies, technologies, practices and investments,
  - b. finance, technology, capacity building, and institutional opportunities, and
  - c. the most significant barriers.
2. What is required to further strengthen international cooperation to enhance ambition and enable the effective implementation of NDCs and NAPs?

Submissions will be made publicly available unless indicated otherwise.
