



**NATIONAL STATEMENT**  
**By Head of the Cambodian Delegation,**  
**H.E. Dr. EANG Sophalleth, Minister of Environment**  
**At the 30<sup>th</sup> UN Climate Change Conference,**  
**Belém 10-21 November 2025**

**Excellency Mr. President**

**Excellencies, Ladies and Gentlemen**

1. The Cambodian delegation appreciates the Federative Republic of Brazil and the UNFCCC Secretariat for hosting the 30th UN Climate Change Conference here in the beautiful city of Belém.
2. The political stability fostered by **Samdech Akka Moha Sena Padei Techo Hun Sen, President of the Senate**, has laid the groundwork for our sustainable development goals.
3. Under the leadership of **Samdech Moha Borvor Thipadei Hun Manet, Prime Minister of the Kingdom of Cambodia**, Cambodia reaffirmed its commitment to the Paris Agreement by submitting its NDC 3.0 on August 8, 2025. This plan increases the country's climate ambition, outlining a clear strategy to reduce GHG by up to 55% by 2035 compared to a business-as-usual

scenario. Cambodia's NDC 3.0 sets a clear pathway for low-carbon and climate-resilient development across key sectors, including energy, industry, agriculture, forestry, and waste.

4. On forests and ecosystems, Cambodia is scaling up Nature-based Solutions through restoring degraded landscapes and supporting biodiversity conservation and local livelihoods. Cambodia welcomes the Tropical Forest Forever Facility to provide results-based financial support to Tropical Forest Countries.
5. As one of the most climate-vulnerable countries, Cambodia welcomes the operationalization of the Fund for Responding to Loss and Damage and call for its swift capitalization with needs-based, and grant-based financing.
6. On climate finance, Cambodia and other developing countries are calling for scaled-up, predictable, affordable, and accessible climate finance that truly reflects the scale of our shared challenge. Direct access to funds, simplified procedures, and mobilization of private and innovative finance will be key to unlocking climate ambition at all levels.
7. Cambodia remains deeply committed to working with all partners to advance mutual benefits for people, economies, and ecosystems alike.
