

CGE work programme for 2022-2026

The CGE work programme has been updated at its 9th meeting, held from 9 to 10 February 2023, with a view to ensuring that its work aligns with the broader, long-term objectives and strategic priorities, and responds to the evolution of the existing measurement, reporting and verification (MRV) arrangements under the Convention and the enhanced transparency framework under the Paris Agreement, as well as needs of developing country Parties. The CGE work programme for 2022-2026 will be reviewed annually.
