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The Presidency Youth Climate Champion

Established under the UAE Consensus at COP28 through Decision 16/CP.28, the role of the Presidency Youth Climate Champion (PYCC) aims to enhance and encourage the inclusive participation of children and youth in UNFCCC processes by leveraging the unique position of each COP Presidency.

The PYCC performs their role in consultation and collaboration with YOUNGO (the official Children and Youth Constituency of the UNFCCC), and youth within all other non-governmental organisation constituencies of the UNFCCC.

The PYCC has four areas of focus:

Enhance the **inclusion, participation** and **representation** of children and youth in climate policy and action through advocacy and awareness-raising.

Empower young people to usefully **contribute** to **decision-making** on climate through **capacity-building** and **education** opportunities.

Elevate and **amplify** the voices of **children and youth** on climate policy within the COP Presidency, UNFCCC process and beyond.

Catalyse action by leveraging the COP to advance, resource and monitor youth-led climate action.



A note on the year ahead:



As the world moves from climate ambition to delivery, children and young people are critical to the task ahead.

More than half of the world's population is under 35. No climate strategy can succeed without the talent, energy, ingenuity and leadership of this generation. The transition ahead demands new ideas, new partnerships and collective effort at unprecedented scale. The opportunity is clear: mobilise young people and accelerate progress. Fail to do so and the world leaves enormous human potential untapped.

COP31 provides a unique opportunity to unlock that potential at a global scale.

The joint COP31 Presidency across Türkiye, Australia and the Pacific represents a significant moment of global cooperation for climate action. It brings together countries, cultures and communities connected by a shared determination to build a more resilient future. It also creates a powerful platform to connect and mobilise young people globally around a common purpose: turning climate ambition into climate delivery.

This workplan is an invitation to work together and mobilise the talent, leadership and creativity of children and young people in service of climate action. It has been shaped by consultations with children and young people across the world and builds on the momentum created by the COP30 Presidency Youth Climate Champion team.

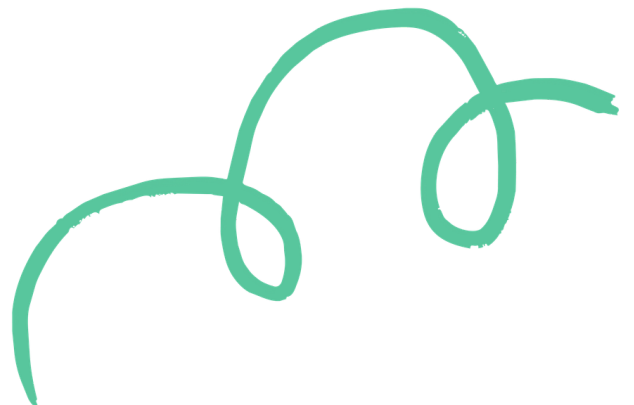
Young people shared a clear message: **they want more than a seat at the table.** They want to be **trusted** and **resourced** as partners in delivery.

Vision

Children and young people are **valued** as **climate action leaders**, **innovators** and implementation **partners**.

1

Enable young people to meaningfully shape international climate decision making.

- Support child- and youth-led participation and engagement spaces at COP31 to strengthen youth influence, including the Global Youth Statement process and other initiatives led by YOUNGO.
- Embed children and young people across COP31 Presidency events, initiatives and priorities to ensure their perspectives shape delivery and decision-making.
- Help reduce barriers to participation in international climate spaces, particularly for Indigenous and Pacific youth, to broaden access and representation.

2

Support platforms, networks, and access to opportunities that help scale youth-led climate solutions.

- Connect and support youth-led innovation with relevant programs under the COP31 and COP32 Action Agenda to accelerate the scale and impact of youth-led solutions.
- Leverage existing and emerging platforms to identify and profile youth-led innovations in food and agriculture.
- Connect young farmers and innovators with policy-makers, funders and other key decision-makers to inform climate action.

3

Strengthen the capability of a diverse pipeline of trusted, young, community leaders to support climate action and adaption.

- Support young people with training, mentoring and peer learning to build the knowledge, skills and agency needed to contribute to climate policy, adaptation planning and real-world delivery.
- Support trusted young community leaders (including but not limited to educators, fishers, farmers, and Indigenous leaders) to champion climate adaptation and resilience within their communities.

Elevate rural, Indigenous and Pacific youth leadership in climate action to influence global narratives, policy and decision-making.

- Create and support existing platforms for under-represented youth voices in international climate spaces.
- Leverage social and traditional media to amplify climate action stories from young farmers, fishers, cultural practitioners and innovators to strengthen public trust and inspire broader participation in climate action.
- Support child- and youth-led storytelling and communications to strengthen public understanding of climate impacts and solutions.

How to work with the COP31 PYCC:

There are a number of ways to **engage** with and **support** the work of the Presidency Youth Climate Champion, including through funding partnerships and collaborations.

I welcome opportunities to work with **organisations**, **institutions**, and **individuals** who are **committed** to **strengthening the leadership of children and young people** and delivering practical, inclusive **climate action** across Australia, the Pacific, and globally.
