The Modalities, Procedures and Guidelines (MPGs) adopted, as part of the Katowice climate package (decision 18/CMA.1), the rules for the implementation of the ETF under the Paris Agreement

Decision 18/CMA.1, para. 12(a), requested the SBSTA to develop, for consideration and adoption at CMA 3, and pursuant to the MPGs:

Common Reporting Tables (CRT) for the electronic reporting of the information in the NIRs of anthropogenic emissions by sources and removals by sinks of GHGs

Section II of the MPGs contains guidance for National inventory reports (NIR) of anthropogenic emissions by sources and removals by sinks of greenhouse gases (GHGs)
