CSE: Pioneer of Direct Access

- ◆ 1st FA project implemented: "Adaptation to Coastal Erosion in Vulnerable Areas":
 this project included an activity to reclaim lands affected by salinity. The results
 obtained in terms of reducing women's vulnerability and rehabilitating the natural
 environment have largely inspired the GCF-funded project, which aims to restore
 agricultural land and mangroves
- Other components of this same project have been scaled up or replicated with WB funding in Saly (breakwaters) and Rufisque-Est (dike).
- Ongoing project (2018-2021) (Reducing Vulnerability and Strengthening Resilience of Coastal Communities in the Saloum Islands (Dionewar))
- ◆ Technical assistance (2016-2020) provided to 11 countries (Niger, Chad, Cape Verde, Mali, Guinea, Sierra Leone, Togo, Mauritius, Mali, Burundi, Côte d'Ivoire) in their preparation for accreditation with the Adaptation Fund. BAGRI FIRCA


CSE Achievements Thanks to AF support
