# CSE : Pioneer of Direct Access

- 1st FA project implemented: "Adaptation to Coastal Erosion in Vulnerable Areas": this project included an activity to reclaim lands affected by salinity. The results obtained in terms of reducing women's vulnerability and rehabilitating the natural environment have largely inspired the GCF-funded project, which aims to restore agricultural land and mangroves
- Other components of this same project have been scaled up or replicated with WB funding in Saly (breakwaters) and Rufisque-Est (dike).
- Ongoing project (2018-2021) (Reducing Vulnerability and Strengthening Resilience of Coastal Communities in the Saloum Islands (Dionewar))
- Technical assistance (2016-2020) provided to 11 countries (Niger, Chad, Cape Verde, Mali, Guinea, Sierra Leone, Togo, Mauritius, Mali, Burundi, Côte d'Ivoire) in their preparation for accreditation with the Adaptation Fund. BAGRI – FIRCA
