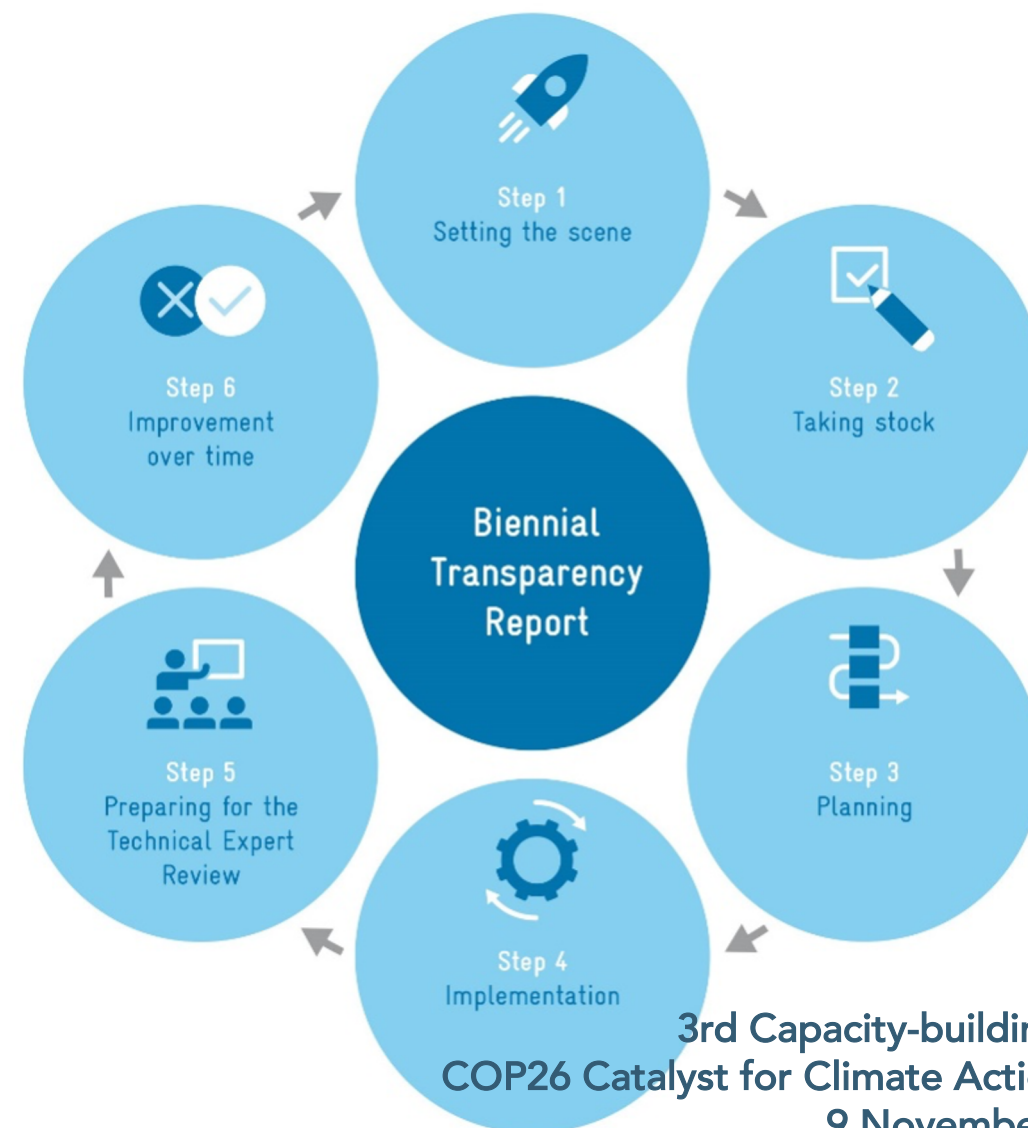

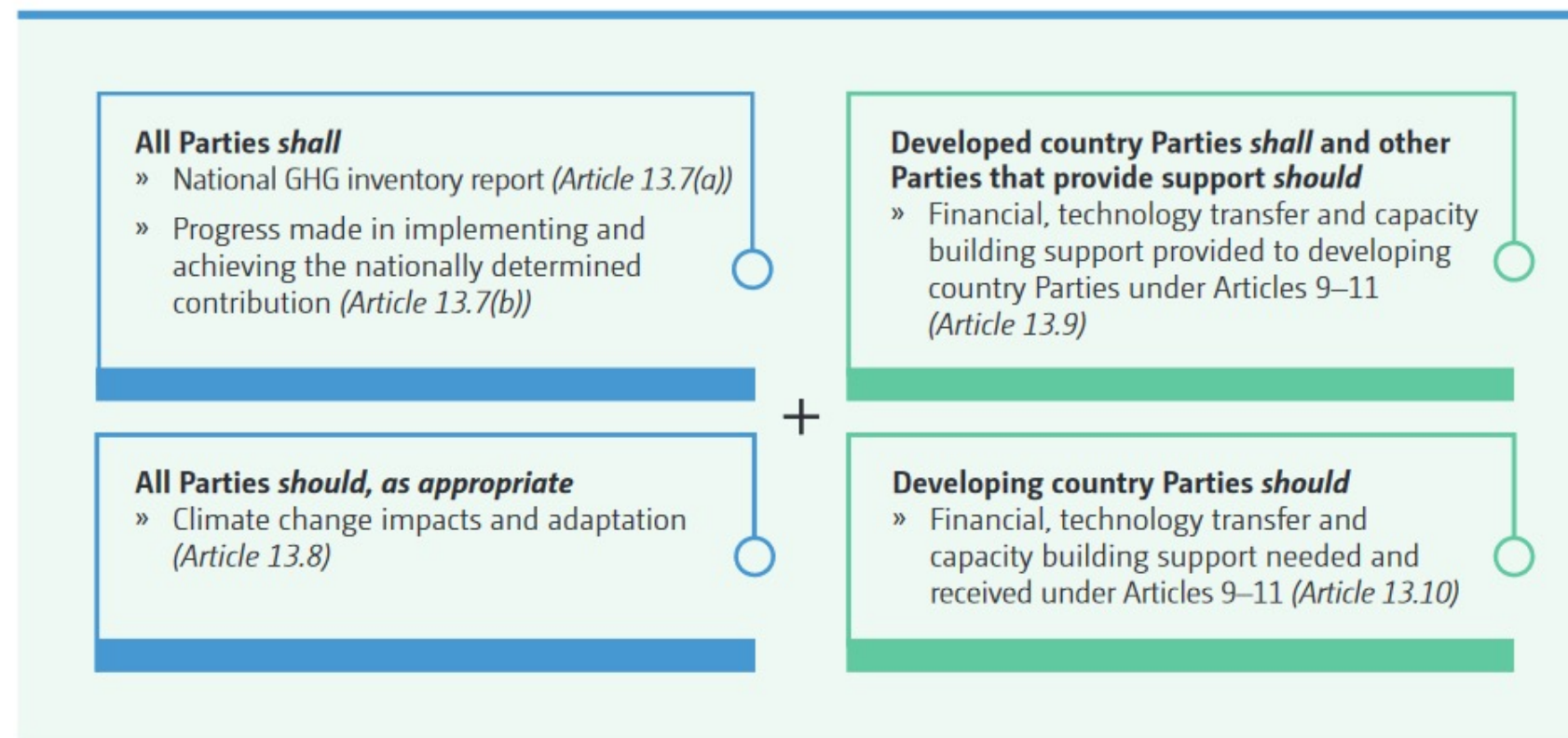

## What do we need this tool for?

- Ensure a smooth transition from reporting BURs to BTRs
- Guide the design and set-up of the transparency system underpinning the BTR process
- Get an orientation of the time required for the BTR implementation





# Biennial Transparency Report Guidance and Roadmap Tool

- A collaborative effort of FAO and PATPA
- Based on experiences on MRV and transparency-related projects
- Objective: support countries in planning the preparation of their first biennial transparency report



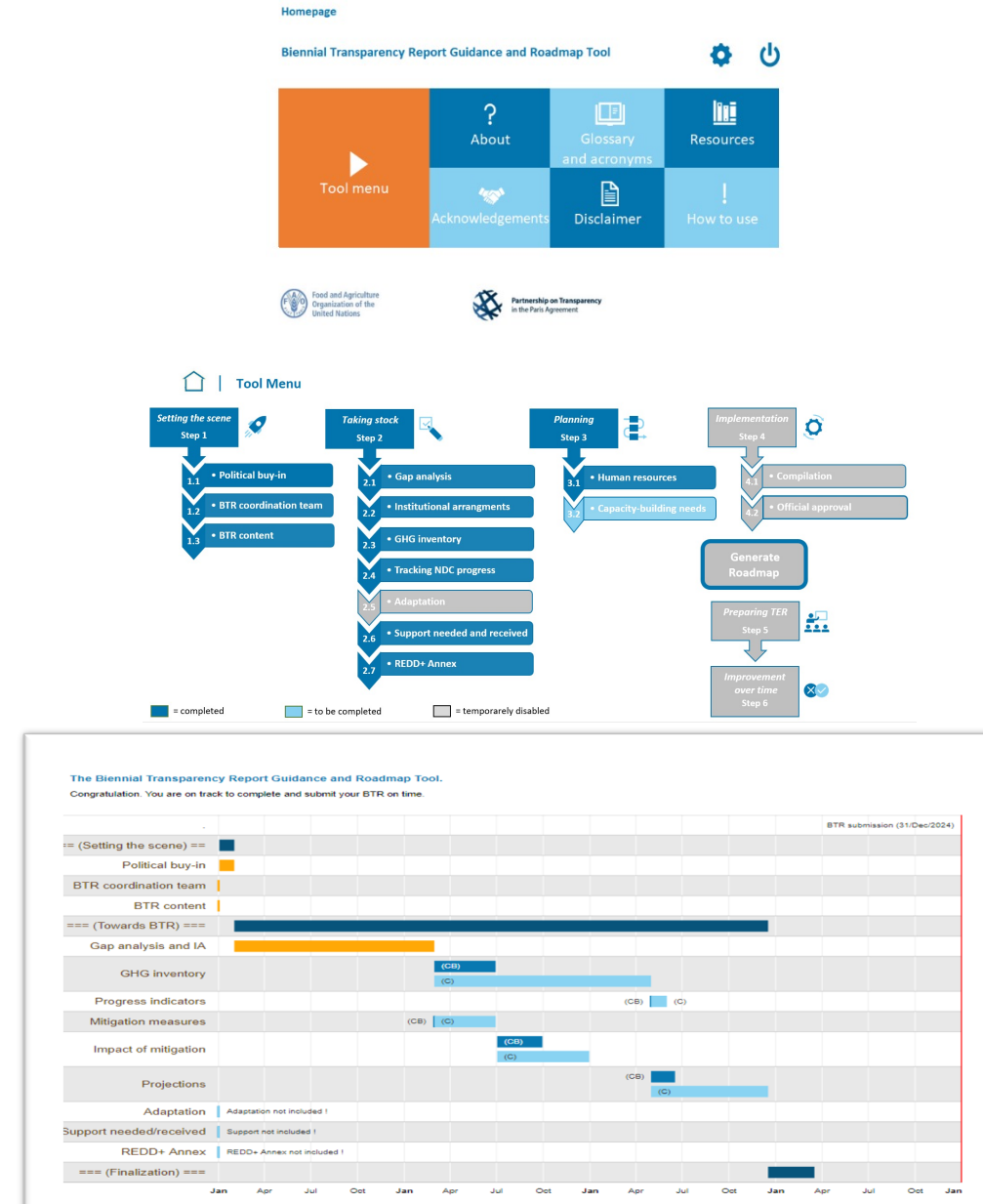


# Main elements of the tool

**Stocktaking:** help countries map out what the current in-country reporting arrangements are

**ETF Requirements Mapping:** guide countries to understand the new requirements and planning for the BTR implementation

**Roadmap generation:** provides a summary of the necessary steps leading up to the BTR with *indicative* required time period to complete capacity development needed

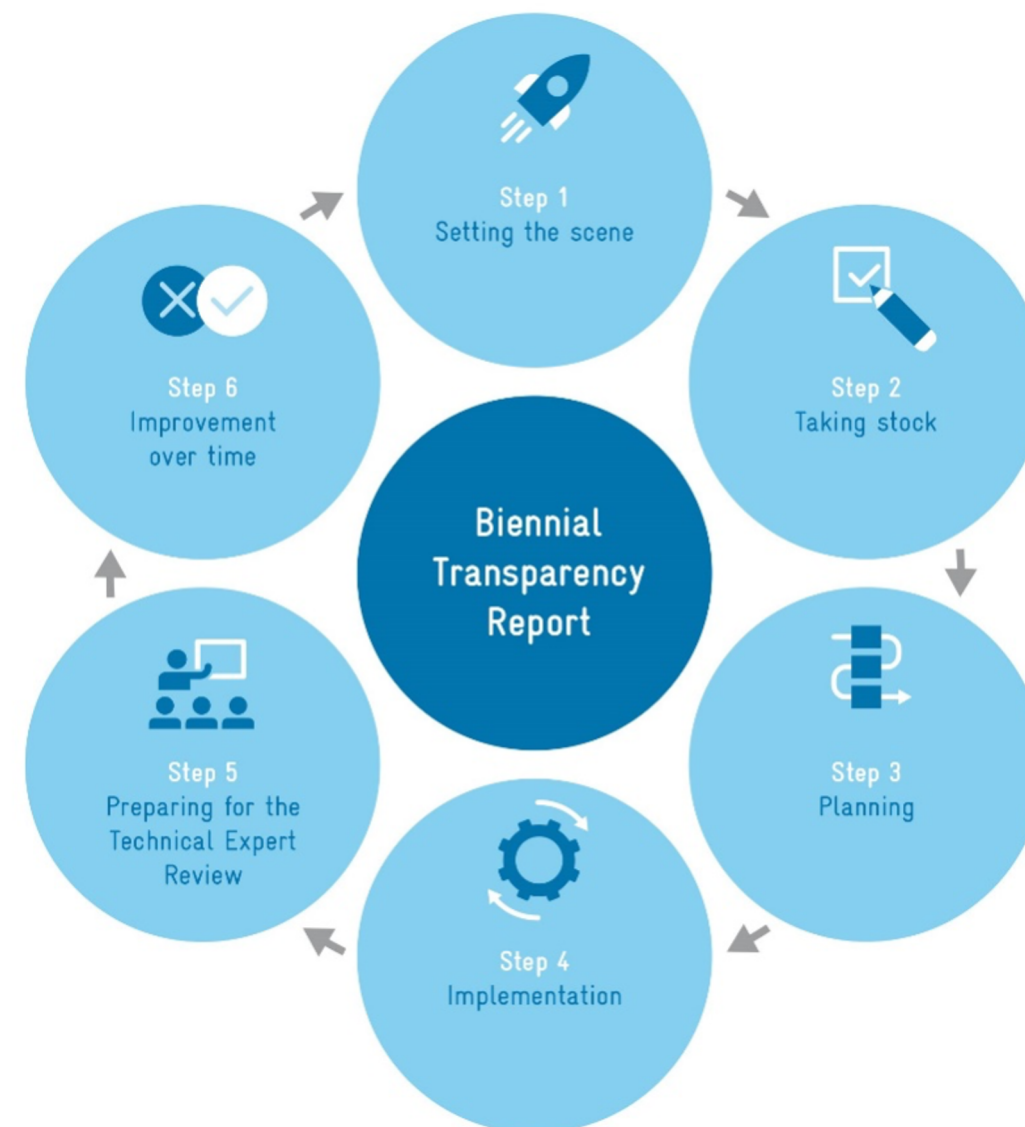






# How does this tool work?

- 1) **Six main steps**
- 2) Guidance and recommendations to **improve the quality of the process** over time
- 3) Questions posed to **check national circumstances and reporting capacities**
- 4) **Elaboration of a country-driven roadmap** (time based on assumption)





## Six steps to get ready



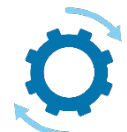
**Setting the scene and appointing the BTR coordination team**
