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
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Transparency in the context of the MPGs



Article 13 decision 18/CMA.1, Paris Agreement adopts the enhanced transparency framework (ETF) for action and support

The ETF is a common framework applicable to all Parties, with specific flexibility provisions provided to developing country Parties that need it in the light of their capacities in its implementation.








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Reporting on support in the BTR - Not mandatory

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


Why map national climate finance flows



For your own national planning.

A prerequisite to identify support needs, and make targeted support requests. Provides an overview of government spending and other national investments.





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




How Countries strengthen coordination? CFUs



- CFUs bridge finance and transparency in climate governance.
- They ensure countries can track, report, and mobilize resources effectively.
- Provide structured data for reporting under the Enhanced Transparency Framework.
- Key role: turning commitments into actionable, financed plans.



- CFUs align financial flows with NDC targets.
- Facilitate budgeting, costing, and investment pipelines for mitigation/adaptation.
- Enable cross-ministry coordination (finance, environment, planning)
- Eg: integration of climate risks into national budgets.
