- 7. √To promote the use of best available science and generate spaces of discussions around science on averting, minimizing and addressing loss and damage, inter alia by striving to reach a broader audience for the presentations at the agenda item on how the latest climate science can inform policy-making.
- r) √Encourage the Executive Committee to consider translating relevant outputs of the Executive Committee and its expert groups to the UN official languages and other languages to maximize their value added.
- s) VEncourage the Executive Committee and its expert groups to continue using the best available science in combination with indigenous and local knowledge.
- t) ✓ Encourage the expert groups of the Executive Committee to continue enhancing synergies in implementing their plans of action.
