### SBSTA 58 agenda item 15

#### Work programme under the framework for non-market approaches referred to in Article 6, paragraph 8, of the Paris Agreement and in decision 4/CMA.3

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1. The Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA) convened at this session the 3<sup>rd</sup> meeting of the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches.
2. The SBSTA welcomed:
  - (a) The views and information provided by representatives of relevant constituted bodies and institutional arrangements under or serving the Paris Agreement and/or the Convention at the meeting<sup>1</sup> aimed at enhancing collaboration between them and the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches;
  - (b) The broad participation of and 12 presentations delivered by Parties and observers in the in-session workshop,<sup>2</sup> including the round-table discussions, to exchange information on non-market approaches, including best practices and lessons learned related to identifying, developing and implementing such approaches, and approaches for which financial, technology and capacity-building support may be required and the support available for them;
  - (c) The use of a spin-off group during the 3<sup>rd</sup> meeting of the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches.<sup>3</sup>
3. The SBSTA took note of:
  - (a) The technical paper<sup>4</sup> prepared by the secretariat, without formal status, on possibilities for enhancing engagement with public and private sector stakeholders at meetings of the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches;
  - (b) The update<sup>5</sup> from the secretariat on the status of the development and operationalization of the UNFCCC web-based platform for non-market approaches referred to in paragraph 8(b)(i) of the annex to decision 4/CMA.3 and chapter II of the annex to decision 8/CMA.4, including on the design work, timeline for completion and testing among interested Parties.<sup>6</sup>
4. The SBSTA encouraged the secretariat to complete the development and operationalization of the UNFCCC web-based platform for non-market approaches referred to in paragraph 3(b) above in time for the 4<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches.
5. The SBSTA took note of Parties' views on the in-session workshop referred to in paragraph 2(b) above, including:
  - (a) The need for more focused and balanced organization of the in-session workshop in terms of time between presentations and the round-table discussions that formed part of the in-session workshop in order to allow for an open exchange of views, engagement and articulation of cooperation opportunities regarding specific proposals for non-market approaches between Parties and interested stakeholders, in accordance with paragraph 7(b) of the annex to decision 4/CMA.3;
  - (b) The positive outcomes, including facilitation of opportunities to connect participating Parties in identifying and exchanging information on non-market approaches

and provision of an opportunity for networking to exchange information on best practices and lessons learned.

6. The SBSTA also took note of Parties' views, including on the need for more informal settings for spin-off groups for in-depth discussion and the range of possible topics for future spin-off groups, including, but not limited to:

(a) How to identify available opportunities and resources to support implementation of non-market approaches;

(b) The process for submitting and recording non-market approaches in the UNFCCC web-based platform for non-market approaches referred to in paragraph 3(b) above, taking into account provisions in paragraphs 2–3 of the annex to decision 4/CMA.3 and acknowledging that Parties participating in non-market approaches may define arrangements based on the determination by their national focal points;

(c) Barriers to non-market approaches and best practices for overcoming them;

(d) Enhancement of interaction with stakeholders;

(e) Preparation of non-market approaches for submission;

(f) Registration and recording of non-market approaches in the UNFCCC web-based platform for non-market approaches referred to in paragraph 3(b) above.

7. [The SBSTA further took note of Parties' views on the need to build [readiness][capacity] within the process under the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches to assist Parties in identifying and developing proposals for non-market approaches, explore opportunities for cooperation between interested Parties, and prepare them for communicating with stakeholders, in particular Indigenous Peoples and local communities.] The SBSTA further noted the importance of the capacity-building programme referred to in paragraph 21 of decision 8/CMA.4 for supporting the identification, development and implementation of non-market approaches.

8. [The SBSTA invited Parties and observers to submit via the submission portal<sup>7</sup> by 18 August 2023 views and information on the key elements of the framework for non-market approaches referred to in Article 6, paragraph 9, of the Paris Agreement, including:

(a) [Prioritized elements for the implementation of the framework for non-market approaches with clear activities and timeline;]

(b) [Identification of opportunities for participating Parties to identify, develop and implement non-market approaches while ensuring achievement of all the principles and objectives of non-market approaches stated in the work programme under the framework for non-market approaches contained in the annex to decision 4/CMA.3] [The process for including non-market approaches in the UNFCCC web-based platform referred to in paragraph 3(b) above];

(c) [Development of a readiness programme to support Parties in developing non-market approaches][How the capacity-building programme referred to in paragraph 21 of decision 8/CMA.4 supports the identification, development and implementation of non-market approaches];

(d) Possible themes for the next in-session workshop on non-market approaches;

(e) [The in-session workshop, including round-table discussions referred to in paragraph 9(c) below;]

(f) [Areas of work and topics for engagement with relevant constituted bodies and institutional arrangements under or serving the Paris Agreement and/or Convention referred to in paragraph 18 of decision 8/CMA.4;]

(g) The design of the UNFCCC web-based platform for non-market approaches referred to in paragraph 3(b) above.]

9. [The SBSTA requested the secretariat to:

(a) [Prepare a synthesis report on the basis of the submissions referred to in paragraph 8 above for consideration by the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches at its 4<sup>th</sup> meeting;]

(b) [Organize an intersessional [hybrid][virtual] workshop, to be held prior to the 4<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches, ensuring broad participation of experts, public and private sector stakeholders and civil society organizations, on:

(i) Progress in designing the UNFCCC web-based platform for non-market approaches referred to in paragraph 3(b) above;

(ii) Enhancing networking and collaboration between the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches and relevant constituted bodies and institutional arrangements under or serving the Paris Agreement and/or the Convention;]

(iii) The matters referred to in paragraph 8 above, taking into consideration the submissions thereon and the synthesis report referred to in paragraph 9(a) above;]

(c) [Organize an in-session workshop, including round-table discussions, as referred to in paragraph 10(a) of decision 8/CMA.4, to be held in conjunction with the 4<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches, to create opportunities for cooperation and engagement on, including, but not limited to, the Joint Mitigation and Adaptation Approaches for the Integral and Sustainable Management of Forests referred to in Article 5 of the Paris Agreement and decision 16/CP.21, with a focus, inter alia, on the Amazon region and other forest ecosystems, encouraging broad participation of interested public and private sector stakeholders, including Indigenous Peoples and local communities, technical experts, businesses, civil society organizations and financial institutions as referred to in paragraph 7(b) of the annex to decision 4/CMA.3.]

10. The SBSTA encouraged Parties, public and private sector stakeholders and civil society organizations to actively engage in developing and implementing non-market approaches under the framework for such approaches.

11. The SBSTA took note of the estimated budgetary implications of the activities to be undertaken by the secretariat referred to in paragraph 9 above.

12. The SBSTA requested that the actions of the secretariat called for in these conclusions be undertaken subject to the availability of financial resources.
