Guided tour to the Richard Kinley Gallery – archival exhibition “The UNFCCC Story”

In its short life, the UNFCCC process has made remarkable history and it must continue to do so in the face of the urgent climate challenge. The Gallery exists to record that history and recognize the achievements of all those who have been part of the almost 30 years of climate negotiations.

The archival exhibition “The UNFCCC Story” in the Richard Kinley Gallery in AHH Building (at AH Entrance H-107 at UN Campus) presents the history of intergovernmental climate change negotiations and the role of the UN Climate Change secretariat through original documents, artefacts, rare photographs and video. The exhibition is open to all participants in the SB session.

Climate change exhibition at the German History Museum

This summer, the Haus der Geschichte der Bundesrepublik Deutschland Foundation here in Bonn is celebrating its 25th anniversary and has updated its permanent exhibition at the German History Museum that includes a dedicated section on the history of the climate change process. The UNFCCC secretariat supported the museum in the revamp of this exhibition, where historic memorabilia of the UNFCCC climate change process are on display, such as the COP 1 conference badge of Helmut Kohl, the COP 21 green leaf gavel (a replica distributed at the COP 21 plenary) and the COP 23 conference bag of Barbara Hendricks, former German Minister for the Environment.

The Haus der Geschichte is located at Willy-Brandt-Allee 14 and is open Tuesday through Friday from 9.00 to 19.00 hrs. and on Saturday, Sunday and German public holidays from 10.00 to 18.00 hrs. The museum is about an 8-minute walk from the conference centre and admission is free.
