COVID-19 self-test kits

To ensure the health and safety of participants and the local community, participants are expected to fully comply with and adhere to current COVID-19 health and safety regulations. As part of its Friday concert series, the Beethoven Orchestra Bonn under the baton of General Music Director Dirk Kaftan, will present a programme featuring significant works composed for the alphorn (a wind instrument used in the Swiss Alps).

The concert will take place on Friday, 10 June 2022 beginning at 20.00 hrs in the Bonn Opera House, Am Boeselagerhof 1, 53111 Bonn.

The highlight of the programme will be "Eine Alpensinfonie op. 64" by Richard Strauss. One of the greatest and most beautiful symphonic poems by Strauss tells the story of a hike in the mountains: from the ascent to the peace and happiness on the summit to the descent in a thunderstorm.

The orchestra is offering a limited number of free tickets to SB 56 participants. These will be distributed at the Information Desk in the foyer of the World Conference Center Bonn on Thursday, 9 June as of 12.00 hrs. Only one ticket per person will be distributed on a first-come, first-served basis.

Designated UN Climate Change Goodwill Ambassador in 2021, the Beethoven Orchestra Bonn is one of the top musical ensembles in Germany and has been conducted by renowned international figures. Made up of more than 100 musicians including 20 different nationalities, the orchestra has a wide musical repertoire and has won several awards for its educational concert projects and its recordings of operas and symphonic works.
