Kind reminder

COVID-19 self-test kits

To ensure the health and safety of participants and the local community, participants are expected to fully comply with and adhere to current COVID-19 health and safety regulations. Please note that while access to the conference venue is not conditional on proof of full vaccination or a negative antigen test, participants are expected to perform a rapid antigen self-test daily for the duration of their participation in the conference. Self-test kits are distributed free of charge to participants from Monday, 6 June, to Thursday, 16 June, from 8.00 to 16.00 hrs. in the lower fover of the WCCB.

Please be reminded that mask wearing is obligatory when indoors/in the venue except when eating or drinking or when speaking in a meeting room or at an event. Physical distancing is currently not implemented in the venue, but participants are encouraged to maintain a safe distance wherever and whenever possible.

UNFCCC Archives Booth

The UNFCCC secretariat opened the Archives Booth in the WCCB main lobby during the SB session. The purpose of the booth is for participants to experience the COP memorabilia, the video clips of historic moments at COP sessions and the photographs of delegates at previous COP sessions from the UNFCCC archival collection.

UNFCCC Archives contains a large collection on the climate change negotiation process as well as the work of its secretariat dating back from INC times in early 90s, including physical paper files, audio-visual recordings, photographs and digital born materials. The secretariat is currently undertaking a project to preserve this unique legacy of the climate change process and to make this valuable information resource available online for Parties and climate researchers to consult.

Guided tour to the archival exhibition "The UNFCCC Story"

In its short life, the UNFCCC process has made remarkable history and it must continue to do so in the face of the urgent climate challenge. The Gallery exists to record that history and recognize the achievements of all those who have been part of the 30 years of climate negotiations. The archival exhibition "The UNFCCC Story" in AH Building (at AH Entrance H-107 at UN Campus) presents the history of intergovernmental climate change negotiations and the role of the UN Climate Change secretariat through original documents, artefacts, rare photographs and video. The exhibition is open to all participants in the SB session.
